The Fine Print



- 👤 PfH is a 1915C Waiver
- 👤 Approved effective October 1, 2010
- 👤 It is the 5th DD Waiver approved
- 👤 Expenditures are capped at \$12,000 per person
- 👤 Enrollment is county by county and adding a county requires an amendment
- 👤 Open to all ages
- 👤 Capacity is managed by slots approved in the Waiver application

The Need



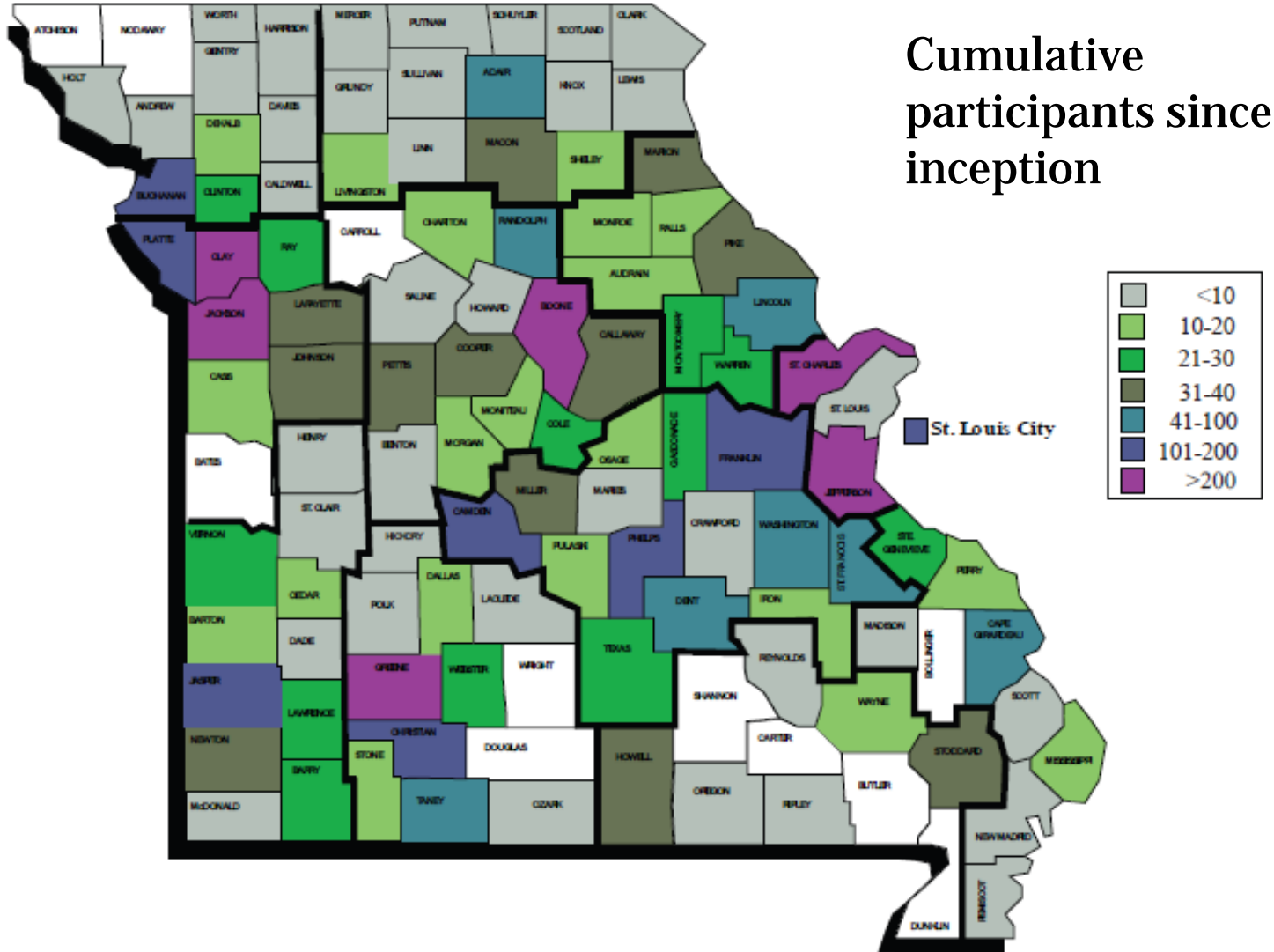
- 👤 **Wait list of 2,000+ for in-home services**
- 👤 **Services were historically based on Priority of Need driven by funding requests**
- 👤 **Strategy to prevent basic needs from reaching crisis situations**
- 👤 **In 2007, the Missouri Association of County Developmental Disability Services (MACDDS) began researching alternatives**

What is Different about Partnership for Hope?



- 👤 The Waiver only operates in counties that choose to participate.
- 👤 50% of the state match is paid by the county
- 👤 Focus is on the entire spectrum of the wait list and not just the most critical
- 👤 The local case management agency determines the Waiver eligibility and approves service plans.
- 👤 Enhanced the partnership between regional offices and local case management agencies
- 👤 Accompanied by a 5 year evaluation through UMKC-IHD

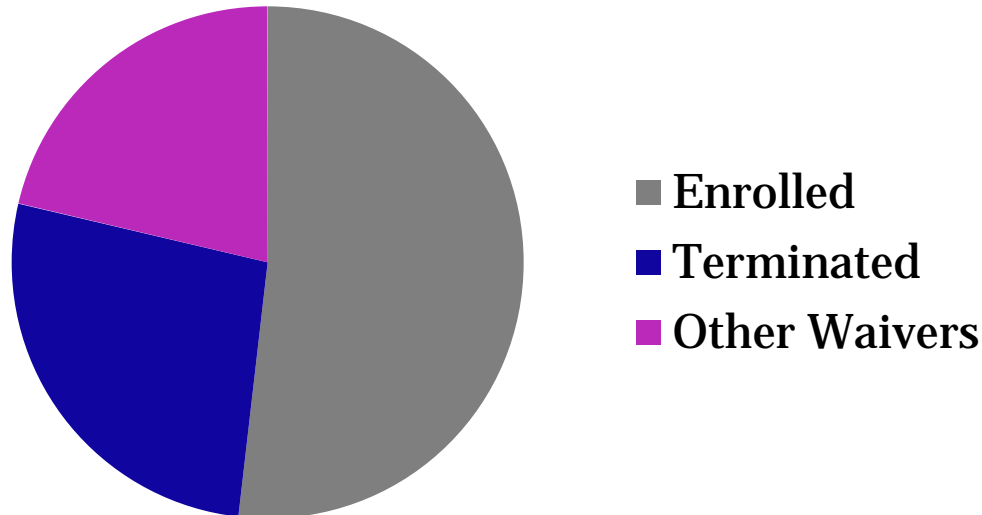

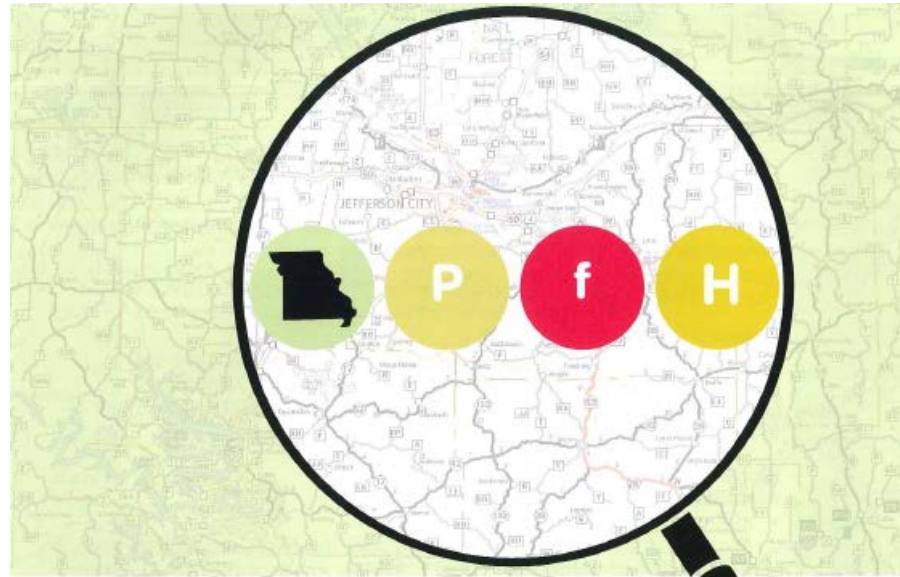

The Case for Early Intervention

- 👤 Total enrolled to date: 4,819
- 👤 Total departures and graduations: 2,322 (48%)
 - 👤 Still Enrolled: 2,497 (52%)
 - 👤 Left services entirely: 1,295 (27%)
 - 👤 To other waivers: 1,027 (21%)

Family Quality of Life

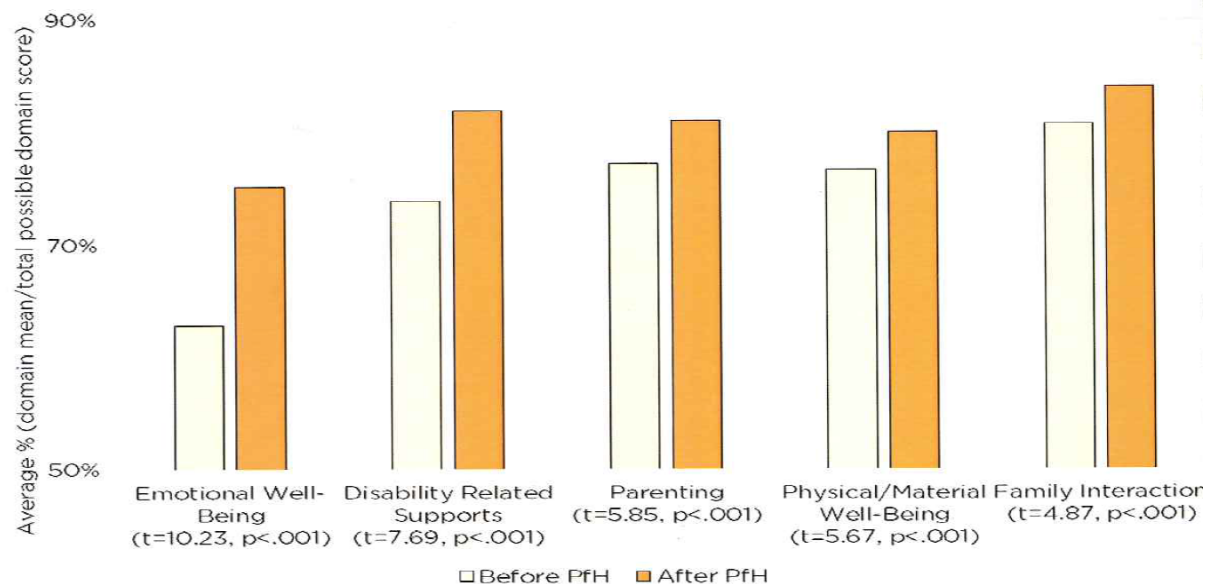
A relatively modest amount of funding has significantly impacted family quality of life:

- Provides piece of mind for aging family caregivers
- Relieved stress and improved family interactions

PfH improves FQOL across all domains: Emotional Well-Being, Disability-Related Supports, Parenting, Physical/Material Well-Being, and Family Interaction.

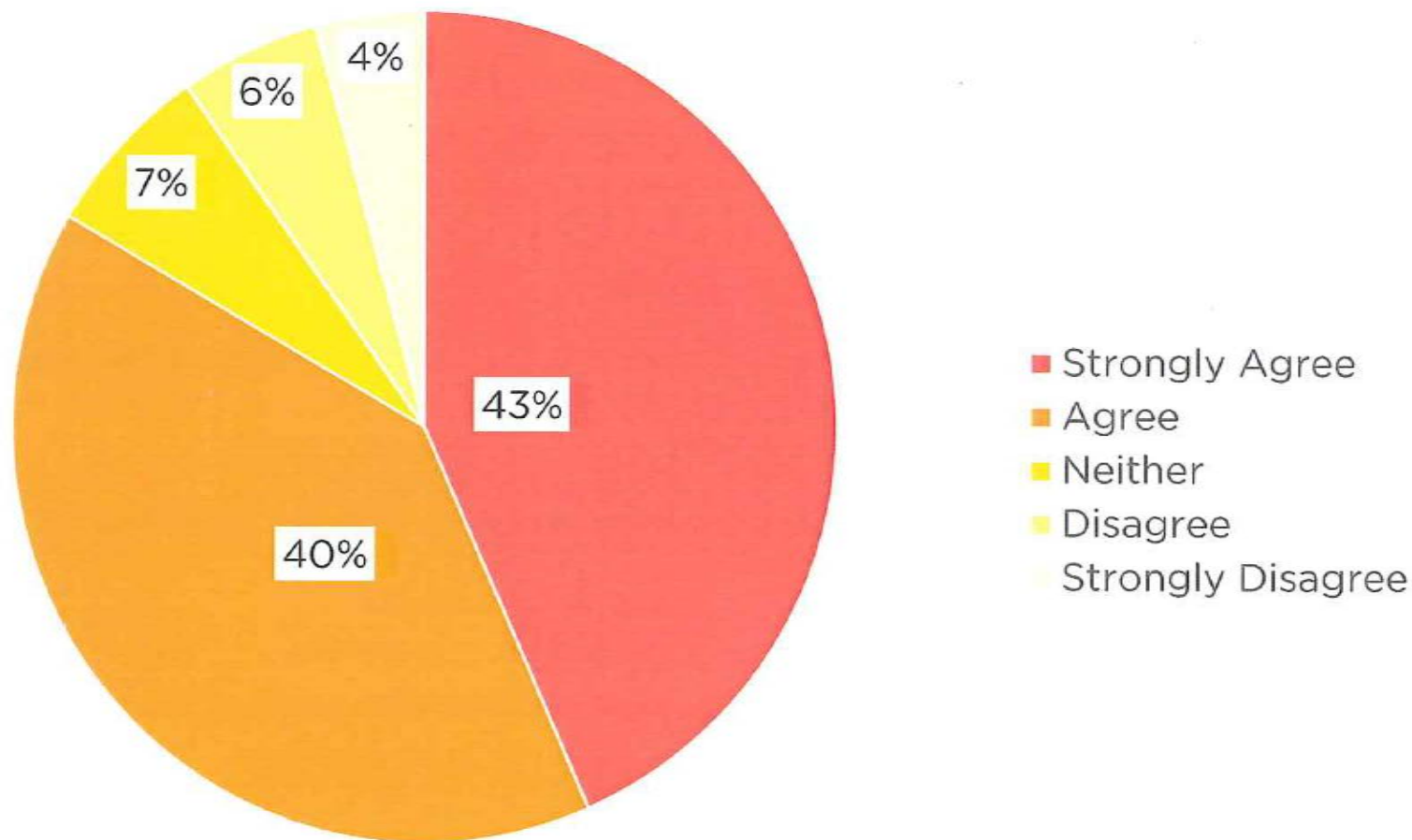
- Helps maintain the family as a system of support.
- Promotes community integration for people with DD.
- Promotes the pursuit of independence for people with DD.
- Makes it possible PfH participants and their family members to work.
