## **Division Directive 4.070-Event Report Processing**

Division Directive 4.070 Event Report Processing has been revised. Revisions include:

Service providers, other than providers exempt from EMT Direct Entry, will submit event reports via direct entry into the CIMOR EMT system. (Regional Offices will be working with providers over the next 6 months to bring all providers on line with EMT Direct Event entry).

Events entered into CIMOR-EMT by providers will generate a DMH-DD electronic Consumer Event Summary report sent via an encrypted email to the Support Coordinator and Support Coordinator Supervisor who is active in the consumer record for a consumer involved in an event.

DMH-DD Staff, contracted TCM entities and Contracted Providers are required to report all events which meet the DD reporting criteria. Reporting criteria is outlined in the 8 categories which is reflected in the Division Directive. Many categories remain the same but the below 3 categories have been changed. Please review the 8 categories for DD reporting criteria.

## DD Reportable Category changes:

- Category 2.f -Emergency Procedures/Time Out reporting category definition changed, requiring only seclusion time out to be reported as referenced in Directive 4.300.
- Category 4- Removed extensive property damage from original definition and focused on disruption of DMH-DD Service because if there is extensive loss or damage it will most likely result in a disruption of service.
- Category 6-Worked with DD Behavioral Analysts to make this reporting category more objective. The focus is on a realistic threat or physical action of serious self-harm or assault of others.

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
