### **(Policy Guidance and DBH Updates)**

October 19, 2018

- 1. CIT at MHA Conference** - Division of Behavioral Health Director Rick Gowdy and Missouri Crisis Intervention Team Coordinator Detective Jason Klaus presented “Crisis Intervention Teams: Why Hospitals Should Partner With Local Law Enforcement” at the Missouri Hospital Association’s 2018 Annual Emergency Preparedness and Safety Conference: Creating Safe Environments to Give and Receive Quality Care Conference. This presentation discussed how hospitals and law enforcement agencies could work together to address the needs of individuals presenting with a behavioral health crisis.
- 2. Early Intervention in Youth Mental Health** - Dr Shona Francey and Helen Nicoll, Clinical Educators at Orygen, The National Centre of Excellence in Youth Mental Health in Melbourne, Australia, provided training Oct 15th -Oct 20th for staff members from DMH, COMPASS Health, Ozark Center, and Burrell Behavioral Health. The trainings focused on youth mental health, signs and symptoms of psychosis, screening, assessment, and case formulation. The trainings amplified the importance of providing services in a youth and family friendly environment. Audience members were engaged and worked to understand how to apply this information to their every day duties in practical ways. The training was a huge SOC-CESS! - 3. CPRP Bulletins/Reference Documents** – Yesterday, new and revised clinical bulletins, along with a guidance document, all related to CPR programs were sent out. They included the following:

Discontinuation of the maintenance (FY 19—047) – *New* – This bulletin contains information about the discontinuation of the maintenance level of CPR and the process for transitioning individuals.

Unbundling Assessment (FY 19—048) – *New* – This bulletin provides information about unbundling the CPR assessment/treatment plan and treatment plan reviews and how to bill for activities related to each of these activities after November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Assessment/Treatment Planning Process (Bulletin FY16-033) – *Revised* – This bulletin was revised to add Psychiatric Resident and Assistant Physician to list of diagnosticians/physician extenders, clarified psychosocial and contextual factors (5.3.7), clarified billing for activities related to assessment and treatment plans, clarified timelines for completion of documents, and added how a Community Support Specialist, Certified Peer Specialist or Family Support Provider bill for allowable assessment and treatment planning activities.

Community Support Supervisor and QMHP Functions – *New* – This document outlines various tasks to be completed, who can complete the task, and how the time for each task would be billed.
