Firewall Changes! ITSD is making some important firewall changes Friday, November 2nd starting at 10:30

2. **Missouri Suicide Prevention Network's First Meeting** - The newly developed Missouri Suicide Prevention Network (MSPN) met for the first time this week. The MSPN, established by DMH and the Missouri Coalition for Community Behavioral Healthcare, consists of representatives of varying organizations and interests across the state who are passionate about decreasing the rate of suicide deaths in MO. MO's suicide rate continues to rise each year; we are now 14th highest in the nation.



The MSPN will work to reduce this rate through increasing coordination of efforts and implementing best practices for suicide prevention.

3. (Blog Post) Step by Step toward Medical and Addiction Care Integration - In a recent review of care integration models, AcademyHealth member John O'Brien and colleagues found similarities on issues related to culture change, data sharing, and payment models.

Boston Medical Center and the BayCare Medical Group are hospital-based health systems that incorporated SUD treatment services into their systems; Finger Lakes Community Health is FQHC that incorporated behavioral health into its service array; and Chestnut Health Systems is a behavioral health center that incorporated an FQHC. Each obtained the requisite state licenses that would allow them to deliver both SUD and general medical care.
