Appropriate CS, PS, and Transportation Billing An official memo is forthcoming, but please note: Community Support, nor Peer Support, may be billed when assisting an individual from one place to another simply because transportation is needed. As always, natural supports should first be explored when there are transportation barriers. When community support specialists or peer/family support specialists do assist individuals in accessing services and supports identified on their treatment plans, please note that Community Support, or Peer Support, or Family Support is billed <u>only</u> when appropriate interventions (per key service functions) are delivered in accordance with the treatment plan and are documented appropriately. For SOR, JRI, and Children's Wraparound, there are options for billing related to transportation needs as outlined in the SOR Implementation Guide, in the JRI provider contract, and the DBH Psychiatric Services Catalog.

Medication Awareness Recovery Specialist Training - The MCB will be starting a new 40 hour Medication Awareness Recovery Specialist Training Program on *Friday July 12th, 2019*, with live training in Jefferson City, St. Charles, Springfield, Kansas City and Cape Girardeau. This program is a comprehensive training program that provides 40 hours of training on using medications during the recovery process.
