Office of Autism (OAS)



- Established in 2008
 - RSM0 633.225
 - Purpose: to develop public policy and programs on behalf of Missourians with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)

DEVELOP **Diagnosing Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)**

- Common Characteristics Associated with ASD
 - Communication, social interaction, behaviors

Commission on ASD



• RSMo 633.200 established the Missouri Commission on Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD)

• Mission: Produce an "Autism Roadmap for Missouri" encompassing the lifespan of a person living with an ASD

Autism Services



Services are provided through Medicaid or Autism Projects

- Medicaid services include State Plan Services and Waiver Services
 - State Plan: Children under age 19 can receive autism services through State Plan
 - EPSDT requires children to receive medically necessary services
 - Includes ABA, speech, occupational, physical therapy
 - DD Waiver: Adults (and children) meeting eligibility requirements can receive autism services through Medicaid waivers including the Comprehensive Waiver, Community Support Waiver, Lopez Waiver, and Partnership for Hope Waiver

Autism Services



- Autism Projects: Individuals may also access Autism services via the Missouri Autism Projects
 - Individual Autism Projects cover different services and may have different requirements regarding Medicaid services

Autism Services - Eligibility



To access Autism Services, an individual must first meet DMH-DD eligibility requirements

- Individuals must have a developmental disability, which is attributable to autism spectrum disorder—must be documented
 - Eligibility is determined through a functional assessment rather than a specific diagnosis
 - The mental or physical impairment must have manifested prior to age 22
 - The disability must be determined to likely continue indefinitely *and*
 - The disability results in a substantial functional limitation in two or more of the following major life activities:
 - Self care; self direction; capacity for independent living; learning
 - Receptive and expressive language development and use; and mobility

Autism Services - Access




To access Autism Services, individuals go through DMH-DD Regional Offices

- Individuals wishing to utilize Medicaid State Plan or Waiver Services must meet Medicaid eligibility requirements
 - If an individual is enrolled in MO HealthNet, they will be referred to a Regional Office or Targeted Case Management Agency for case management services
 - If an individual is not enrolled in MO HealthNet, they will be referred to a Regional Office to determine DMH eligibility
- An Individualized Support Plan (ISP) will be needed and identification of Autism Project services or Waiver Services to be provided

MO Autism Projects





Autism Projects provide services to families/individuals and are intended to improve the ability to receive the supports they need in their communities.

MO Autism Project - Services



Autism Project services vary by contract and may include:

Behavior Management Training & Supports Occupational Therapy, Sensory Integration Therapy Communication & Language Therapy Information & Referral Assistance Parent or Caregiver Training Public Education & Information Dissemination Consultation on Individualized Education & Habilitation Plans Contemporary and Emerging Evidence-based Practices Assessment Life Skills Music Therapy Advocacy Training Crisis Intervention Respite Care Staff Training Social Skills Training

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- Regional Parent Advisory Councils (PAC)
 - Each of the five Autism Projects has a Parent Advisory Council (PAC) that represent and oversee each project and make recommendations for service needs
