


What is a Youth Behavioral Health Liaison (YBHL)?

A YBHL is a behavioral health professional who forms local community partnerships with various youth-serving organizations to address specific behavioral health needs of vulnerable children and youth. YBHLs function as service connectors for youth with co-occurring severe mental illness, substance use, and/or developmental disability to link the youth and their families to services available through community partnerships.



A YBHL will work to engage youth, build relationships with natural supports and to divert youth from inpatient hospitalization and out-of-home placements such as residential treatment centers, juvenile detention, and jail, while supporting youth in natural family and/or community based setting.
