

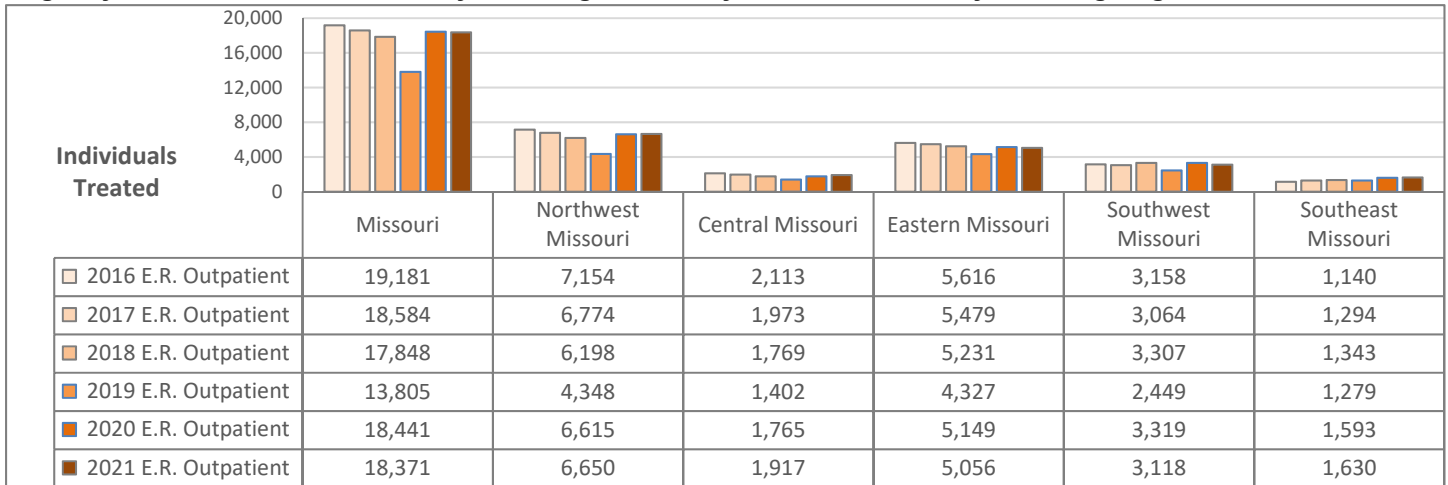

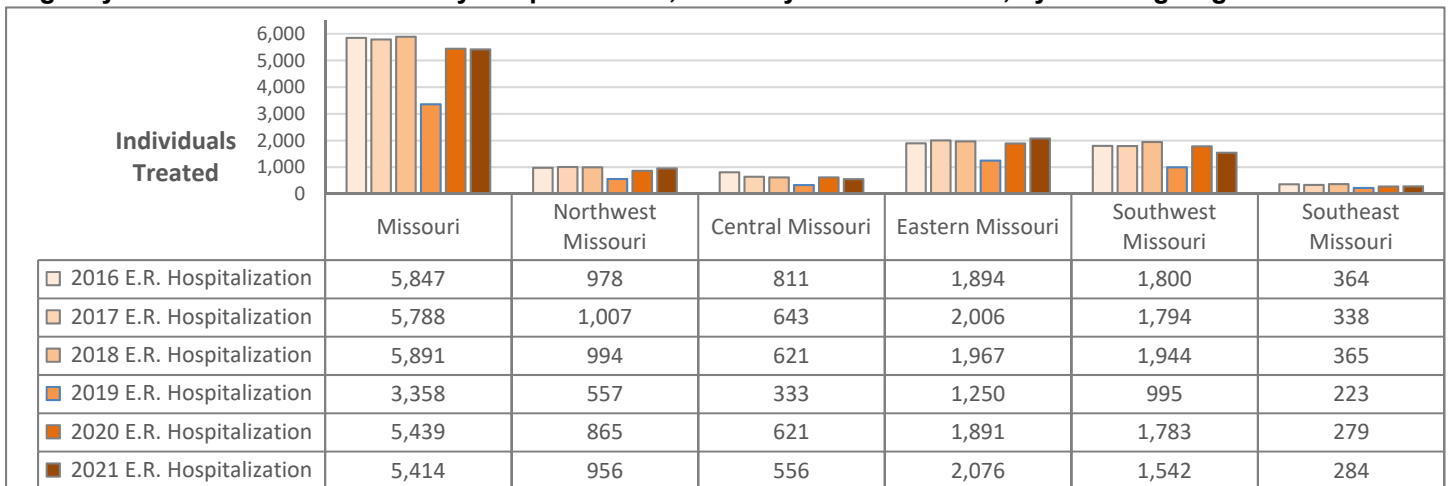

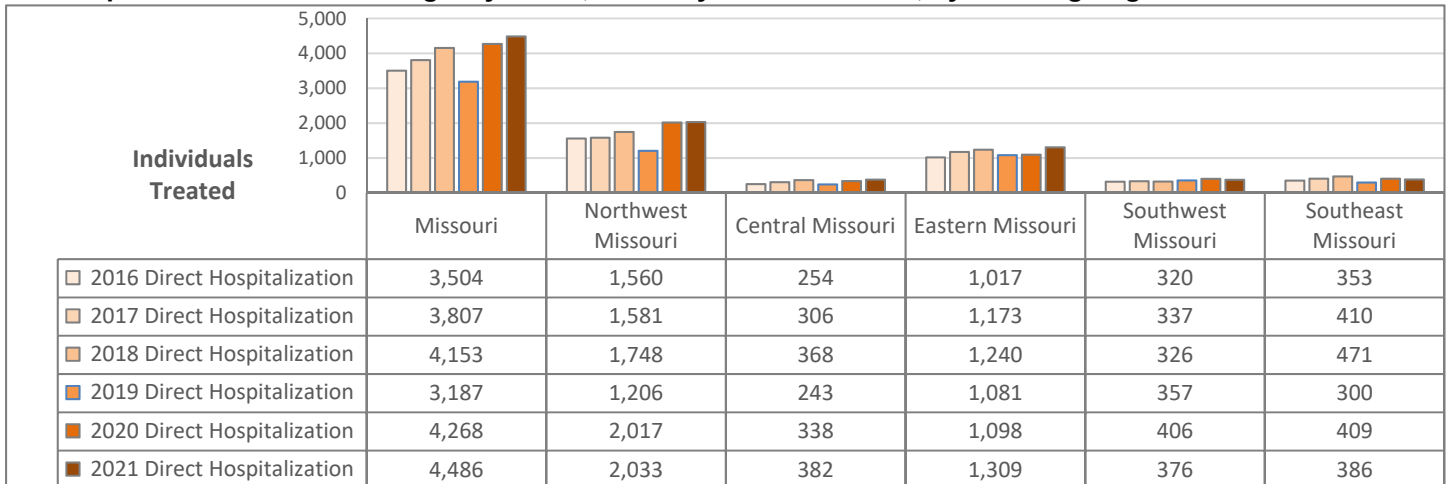
### Emergency Room Services followed by Discharge, Primarily for Alcohol Use, by Planning Region and Year

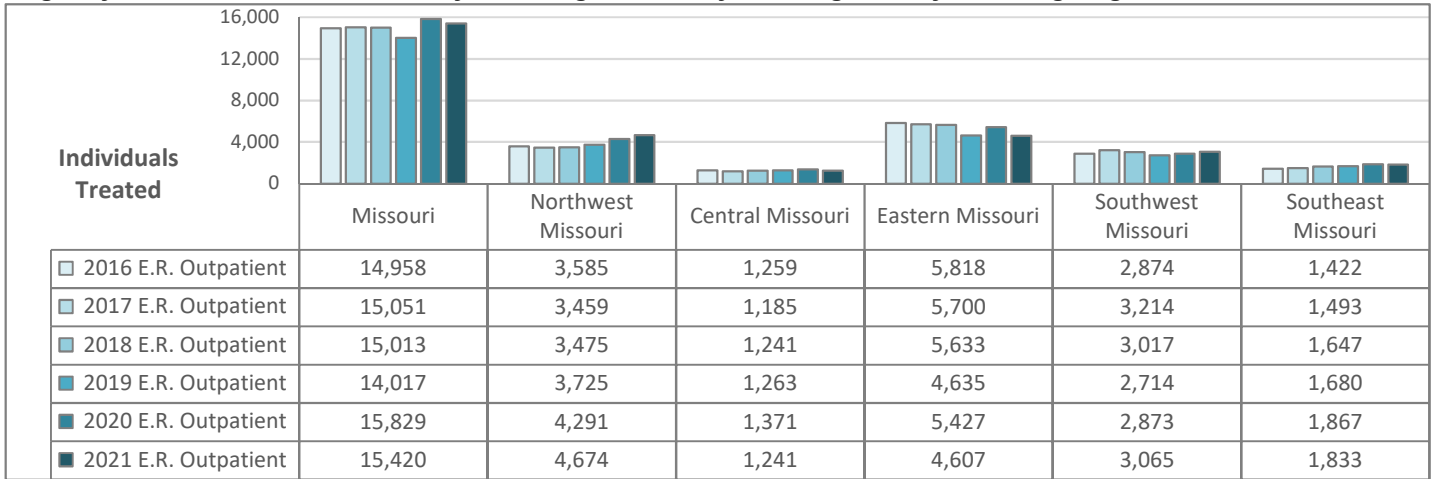

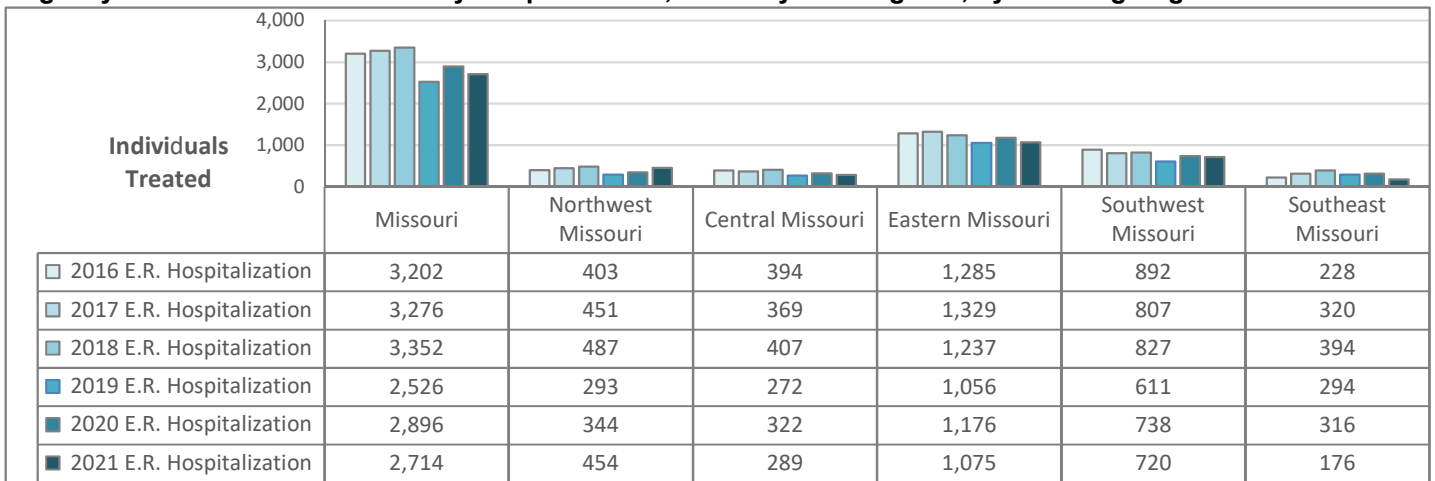

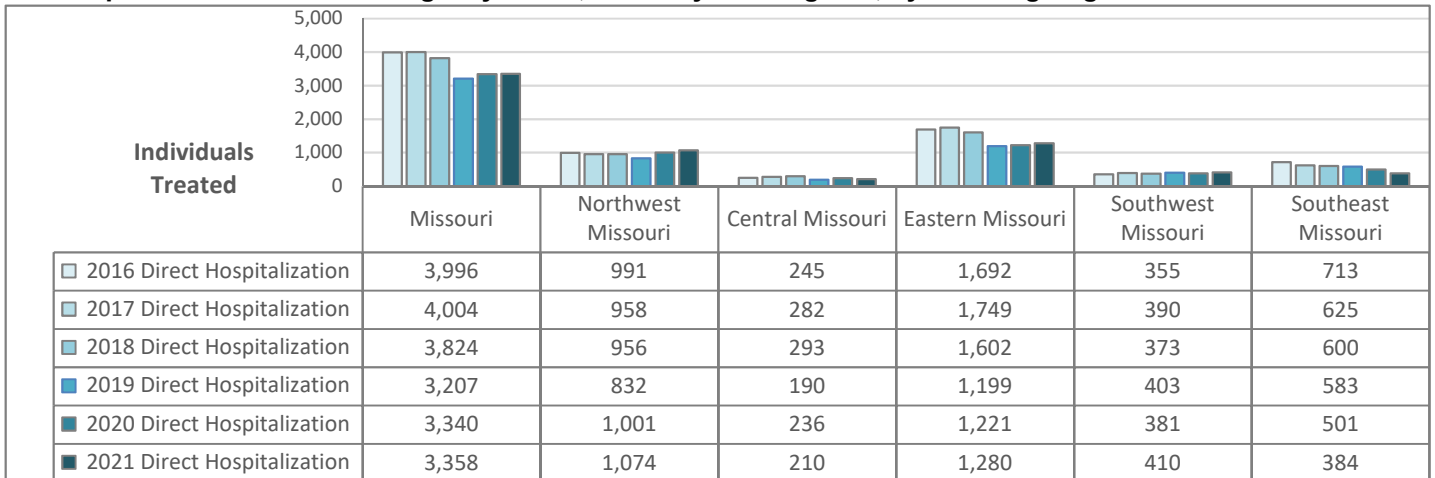
### Emergency Room Services followed by Discharge, Primarily for Drug Use, by Planning Region and Year

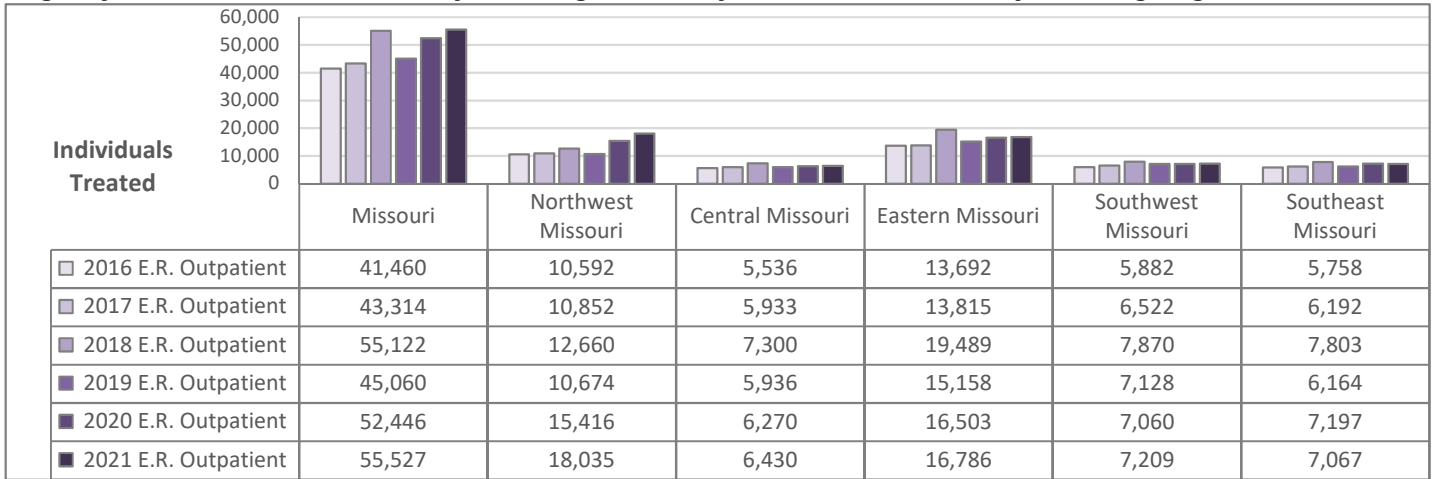

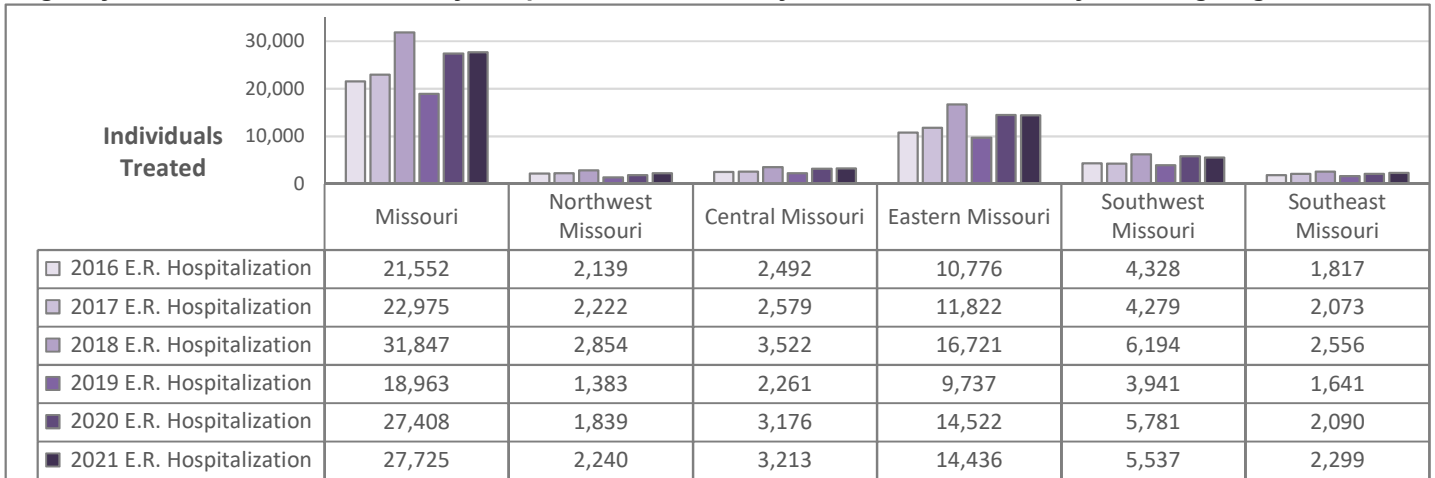

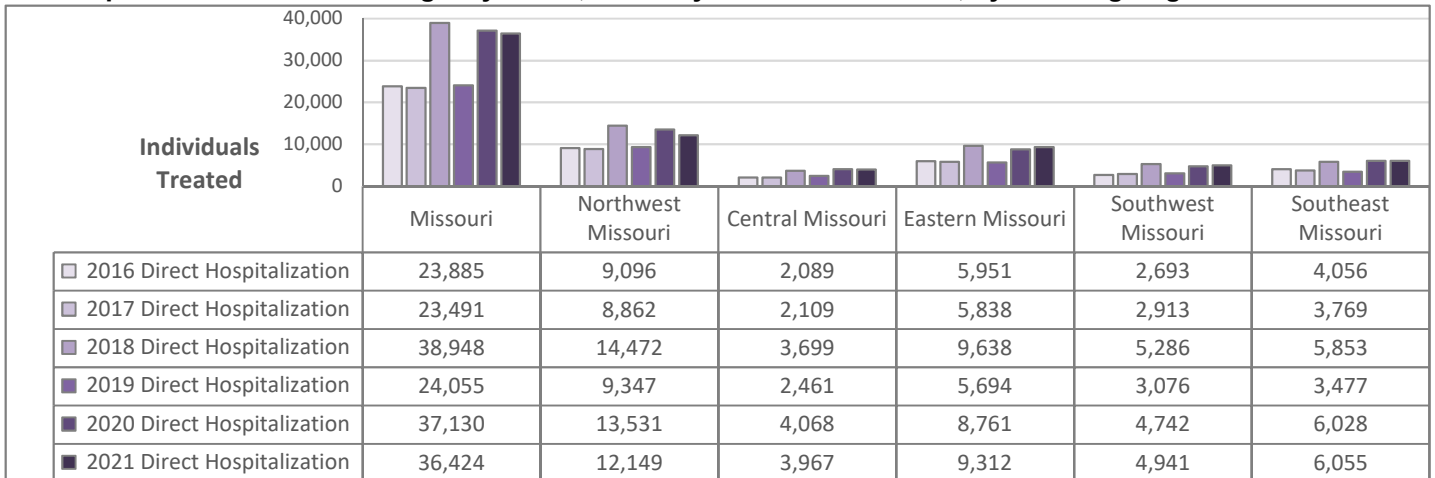
### Emergency Room Services followed by Discharge, Primarily for Mental Disorder, by Planning Region and Year

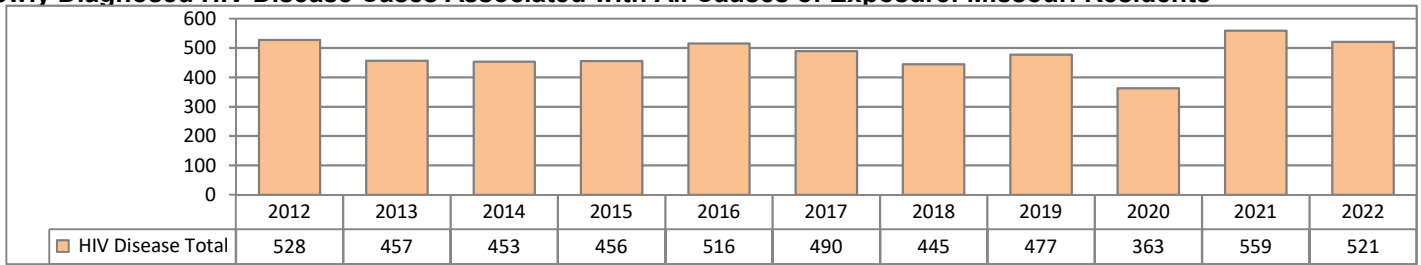

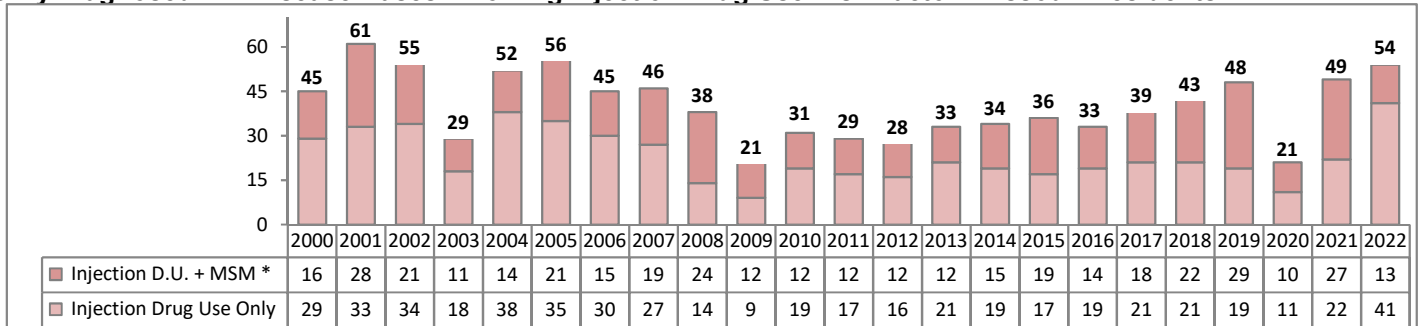

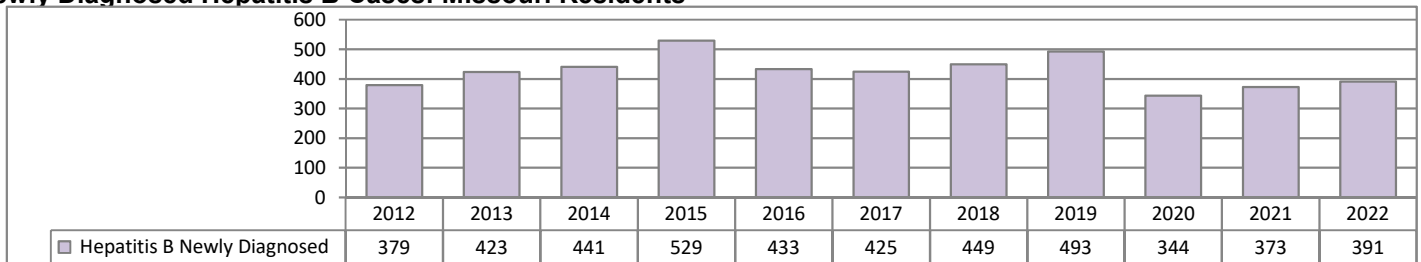
### Newly Diagnosed HIV Disease Cases Involving Injection Drug Use Risk Factor: Missouri Residents



\* MSM denotes HIV risk factor for men who have sex with men.

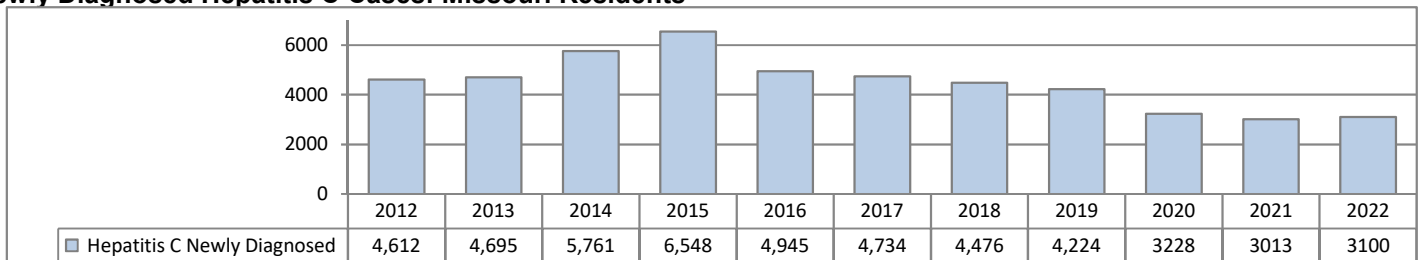

### Newly Diagnosed Hepatitis B Cases: Missouri Residents



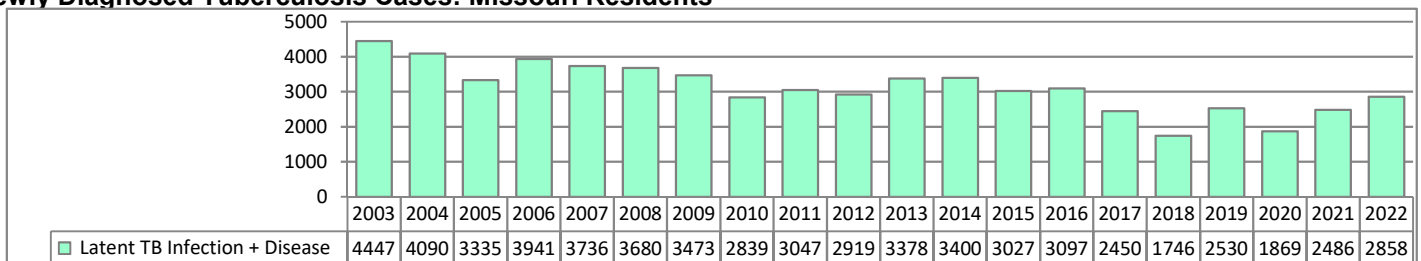

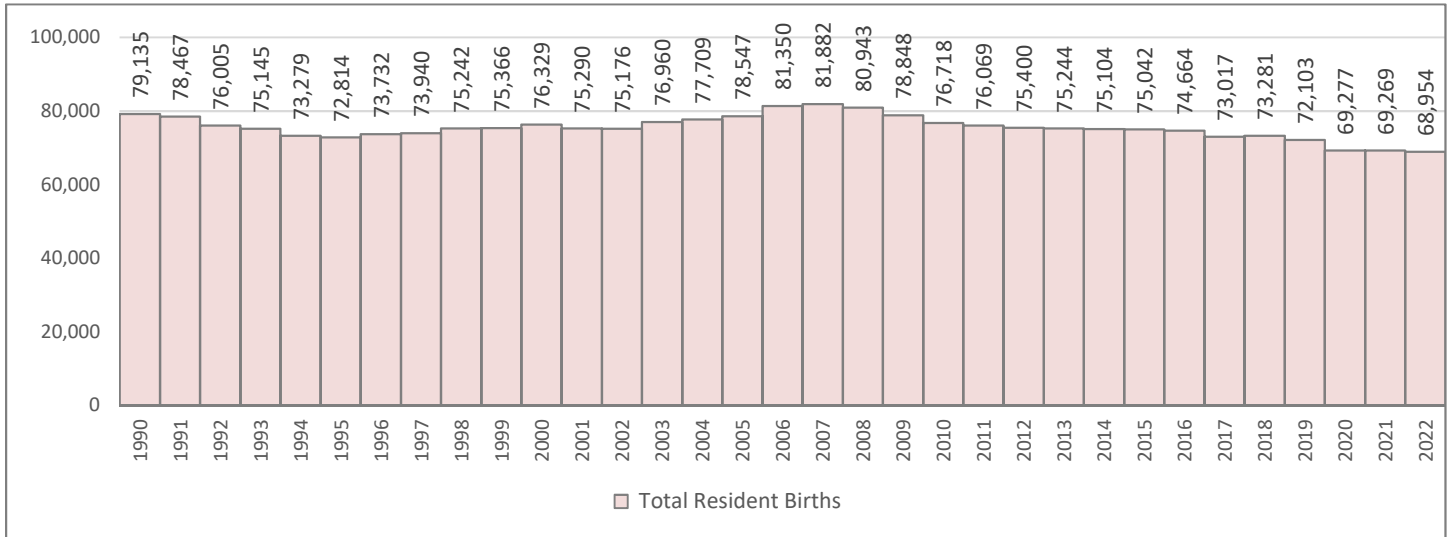
### Newly Diagnosed Tuberculosis Cases: Missouri Residents

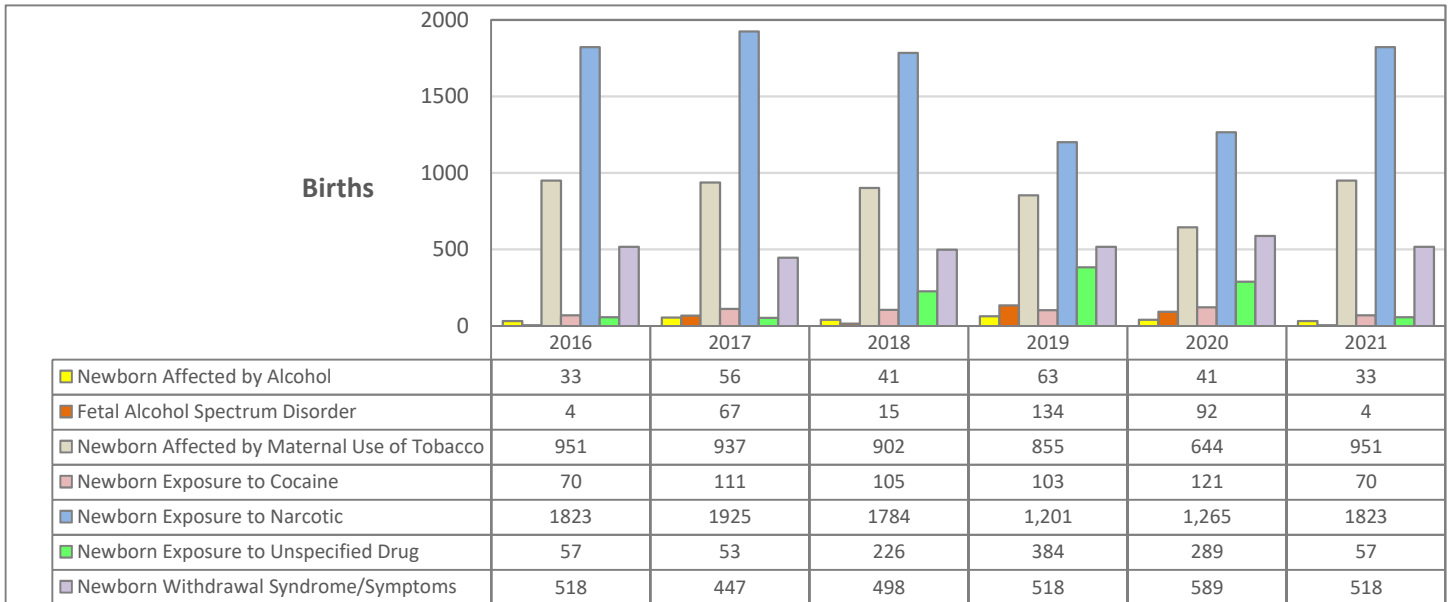

### Missouri Resident Births, by Year



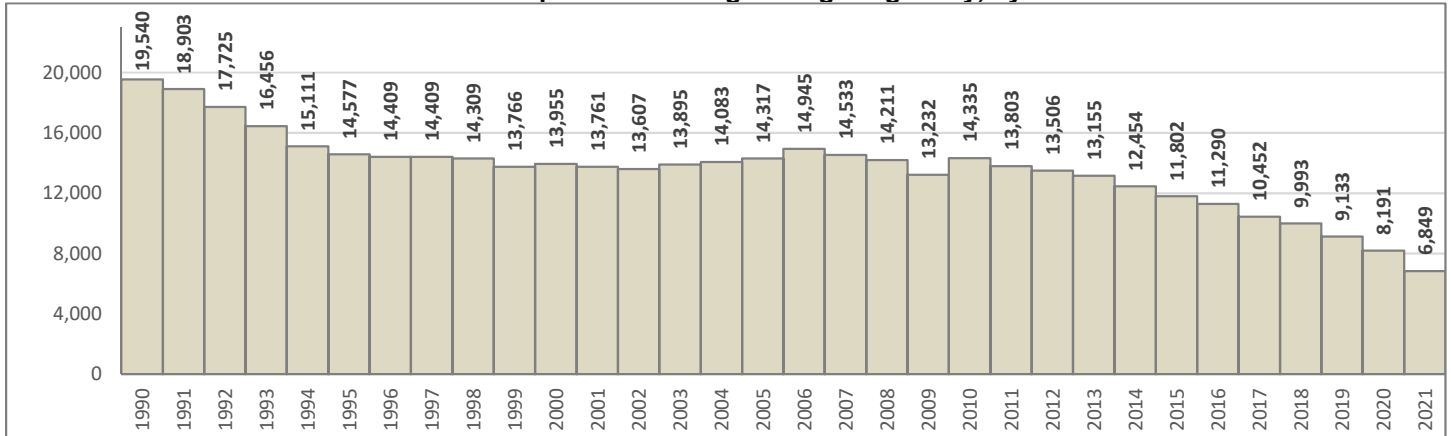

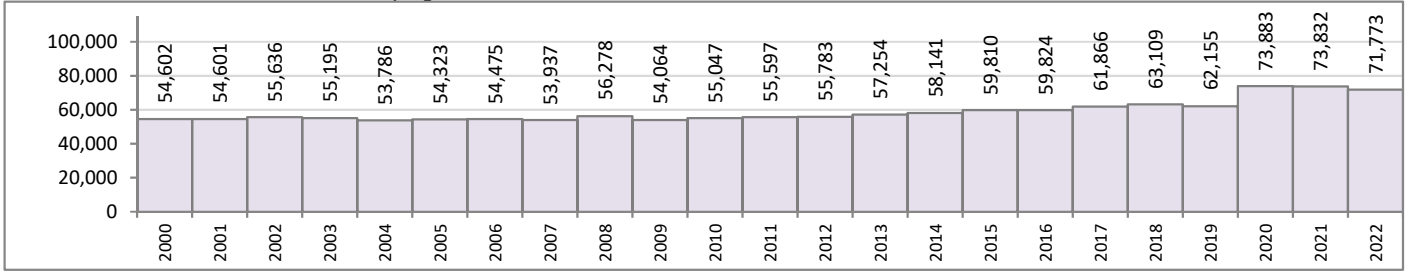
### Missouri Resident Births in which Mother Reported Smoking During Pregnancy, by Year

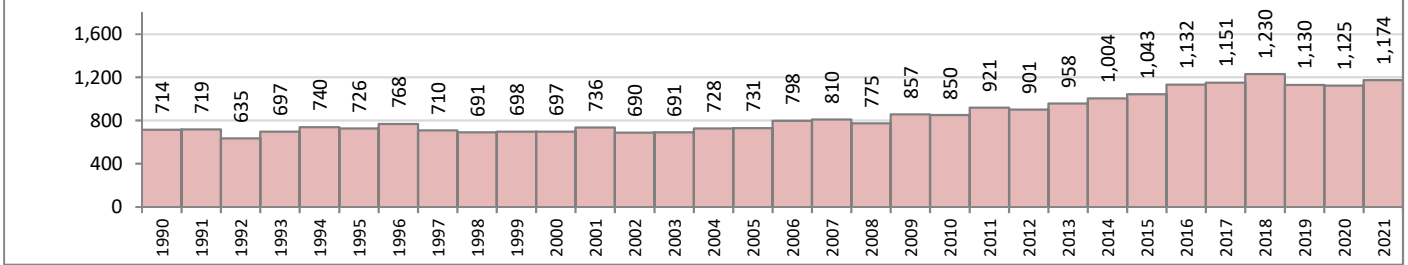

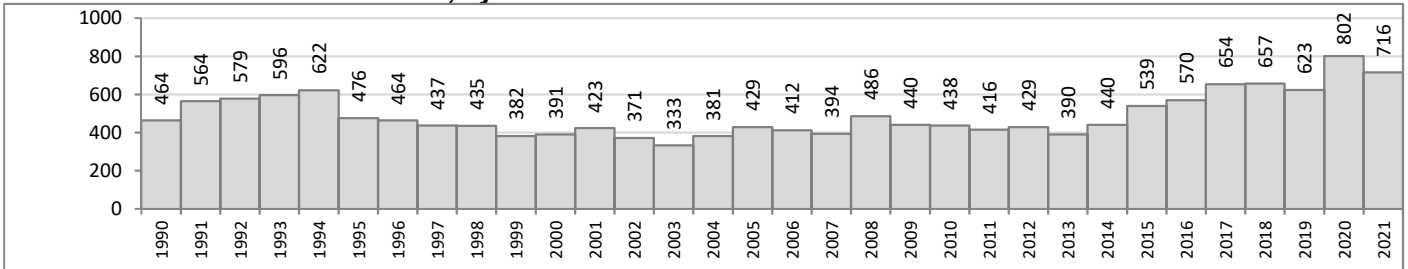

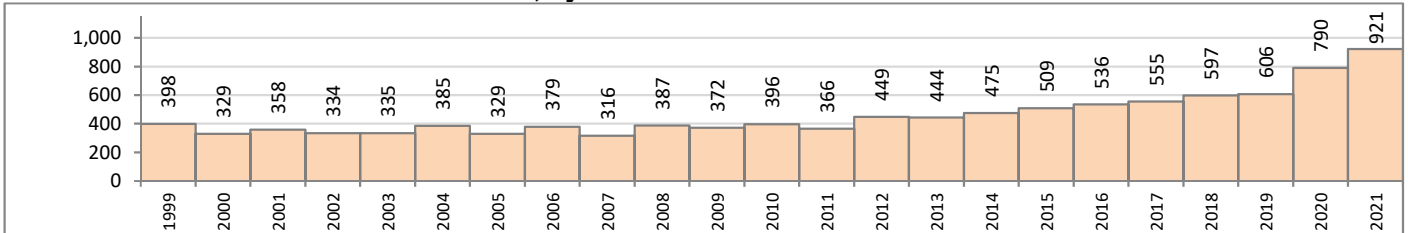
**Suicide Deaths: Missouri Residents, by Year**



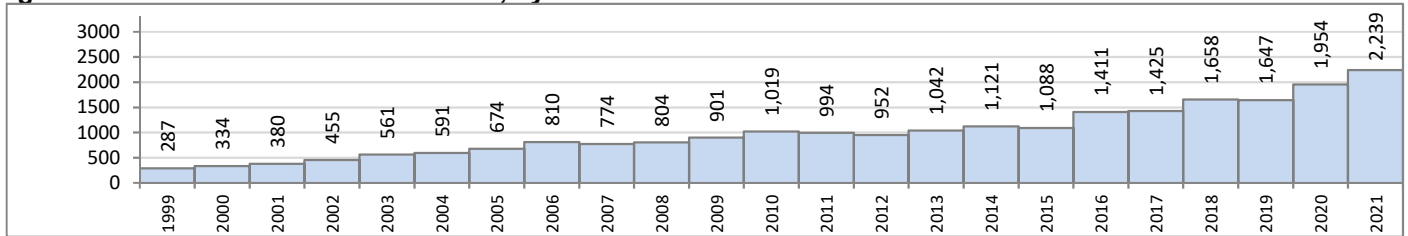
**Homicide Deaths: Missouri Residents, by Year**



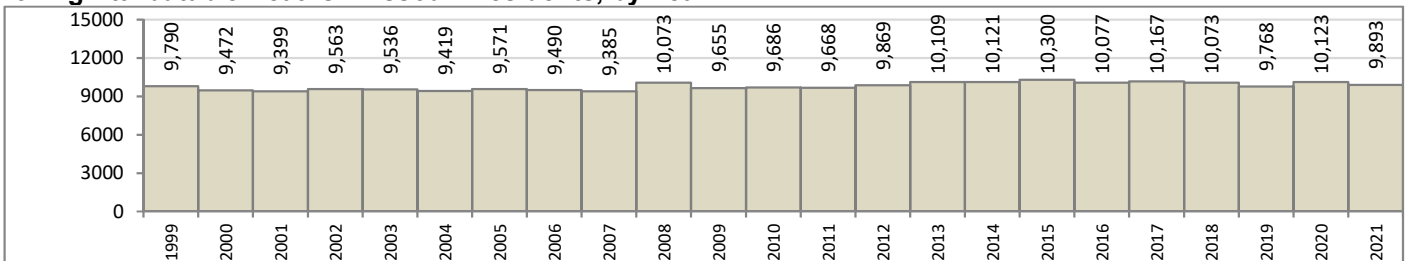
**Alcohol Induced Deaths: Missouri Residents, by Year**



**Drug Induced Deaths: Missouri Residents, by Year**



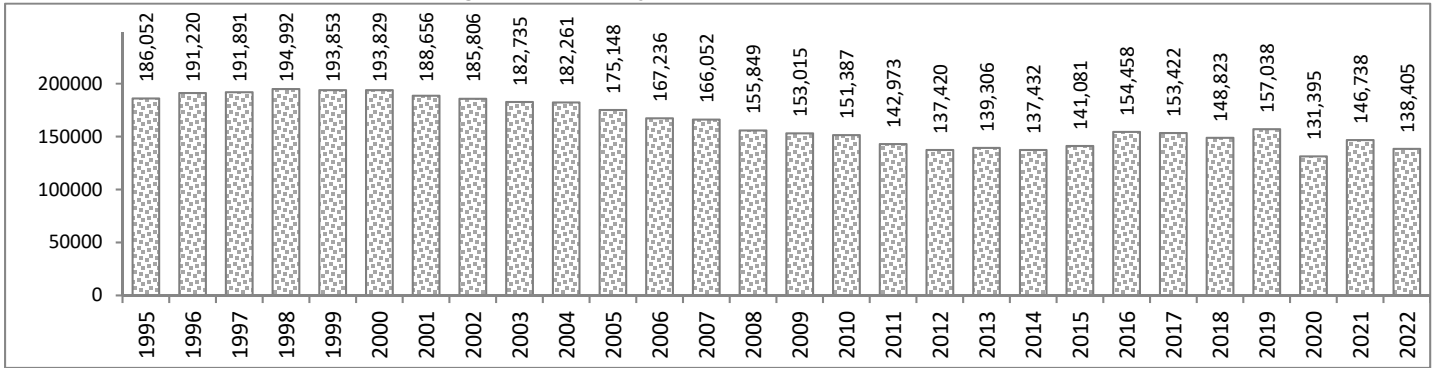
**Smoking Attributable Deaths: Missouri Residents, by Year**



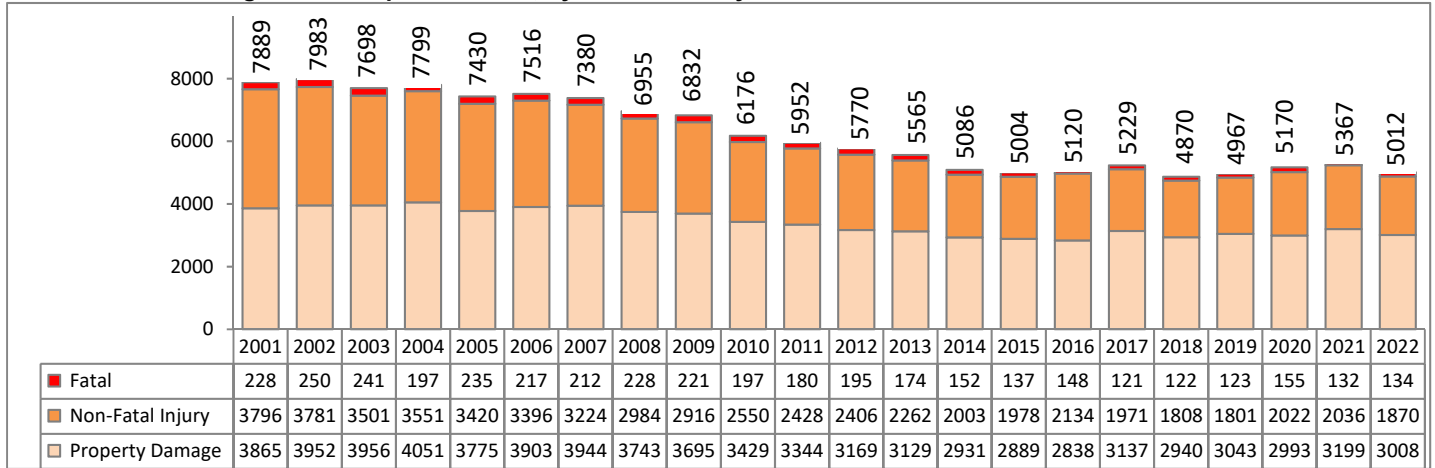

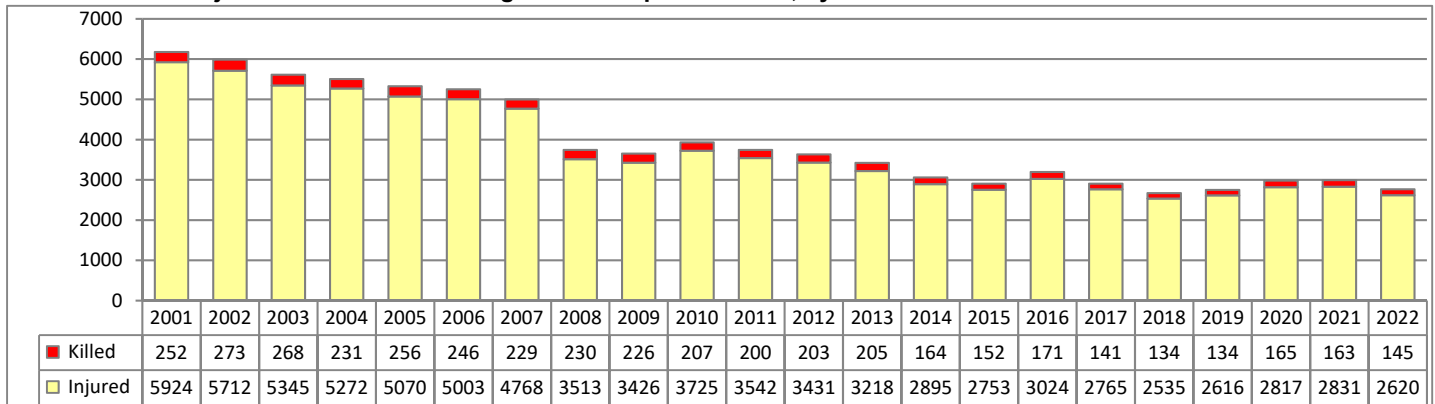
**Total Traffic Crashes (All Causes) Occurring in Missouri, by Year**



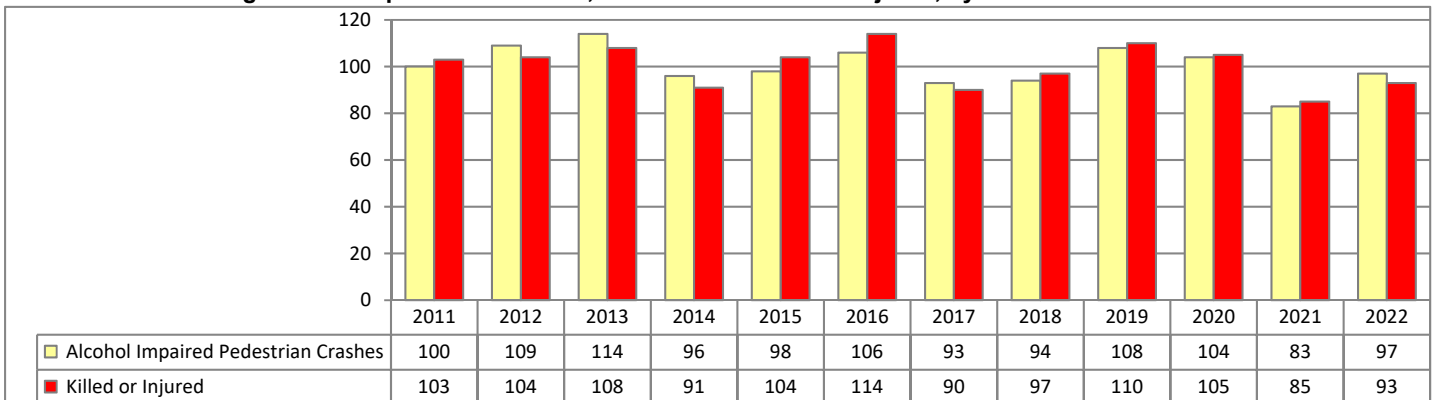
**Traffic Crashes Involving Alcohol Impaired Driver, by Crash Severity and Year**

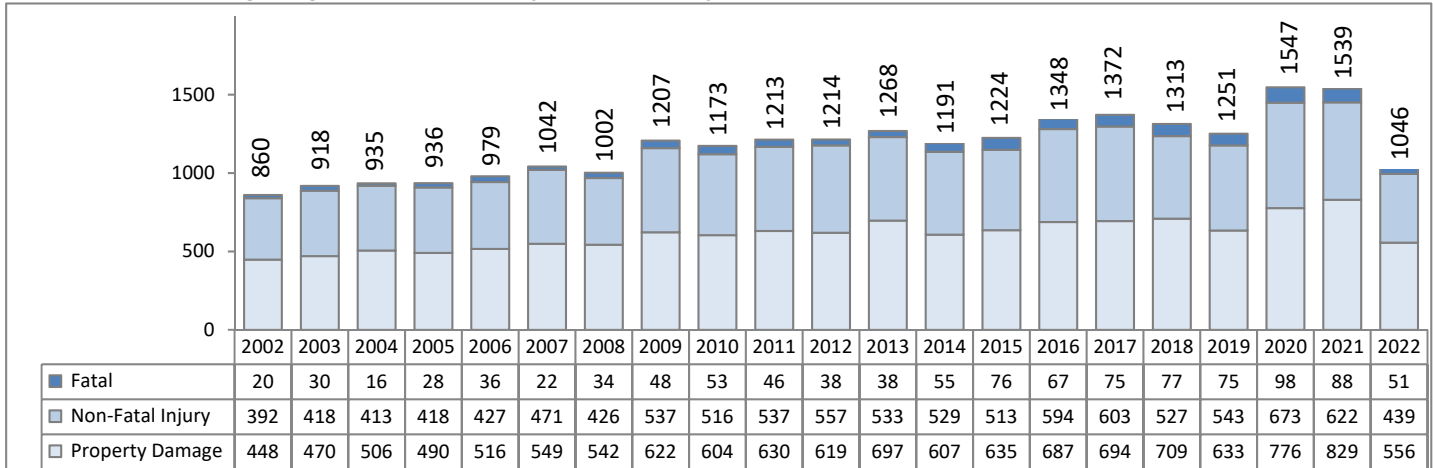

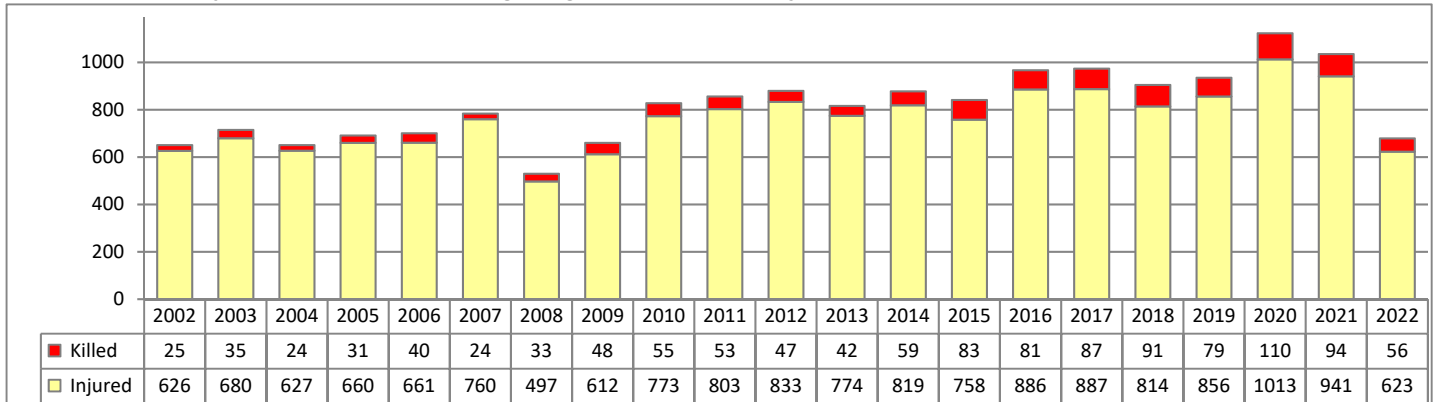
**Total Traffic Crashes (All Causes) Occurring in Missouri, by Year**



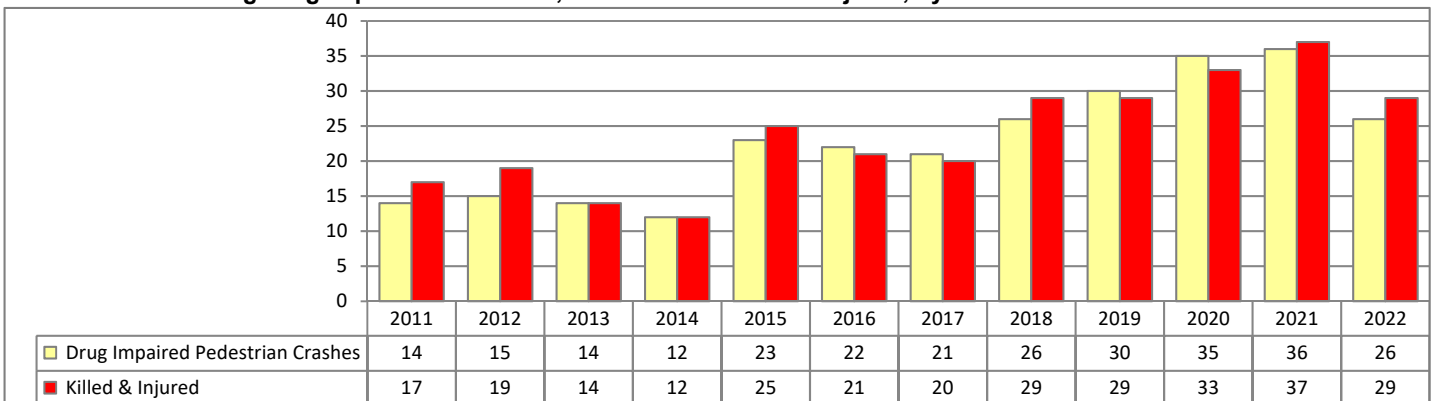
**Traffic Crashes Involving Drug Impaired Driver, by Crash Severity and Year**



**Persons Killed and Injured in Crashes involving Drug Impaired Driver, by Year**



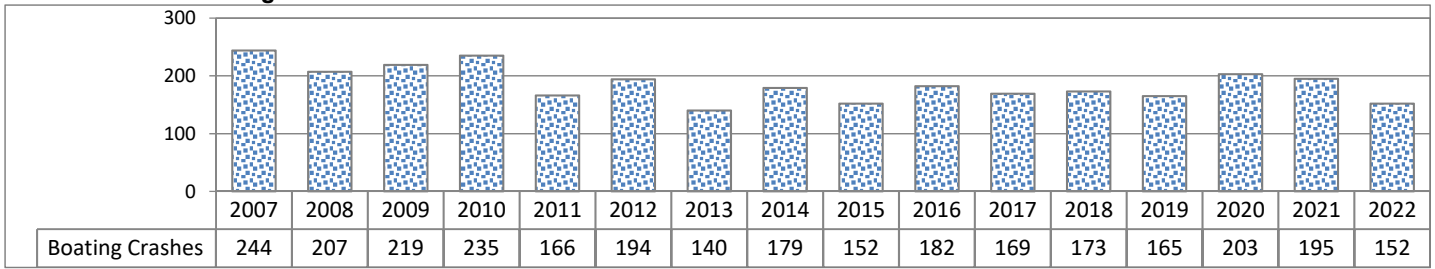
**Traffic Crashes Involving Drug Impaired Pedestrian, and Persons Killed or Injured, by Year**



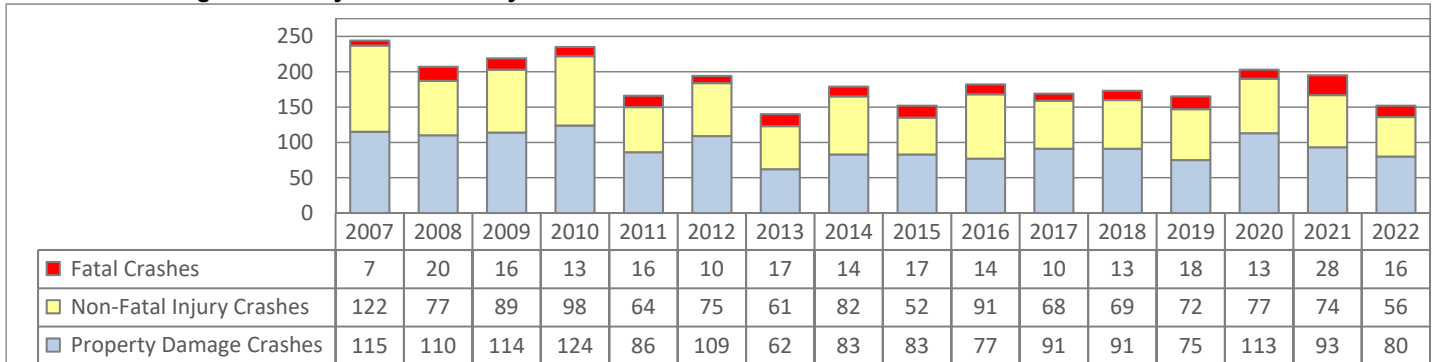

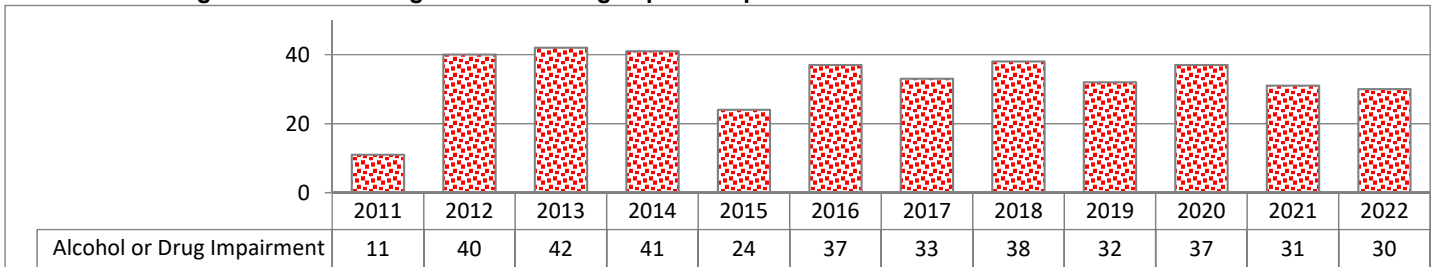
### Total Recreational Boating Crashes in Missouri



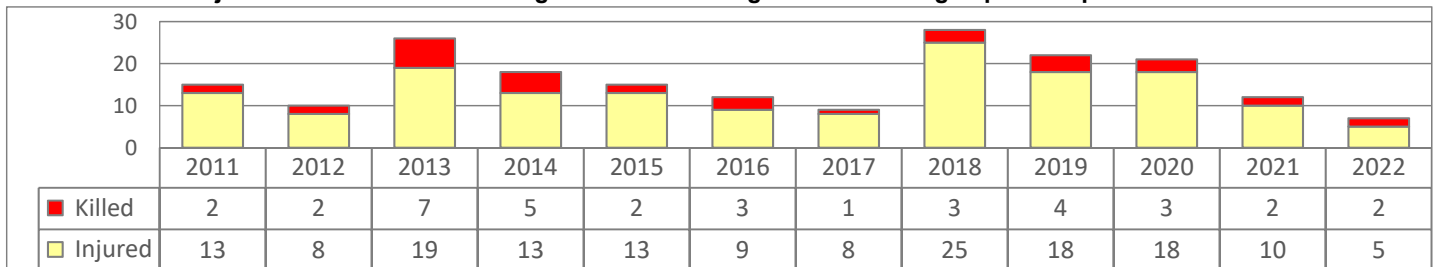
### Recreational Boating Crashes by Crash Severity



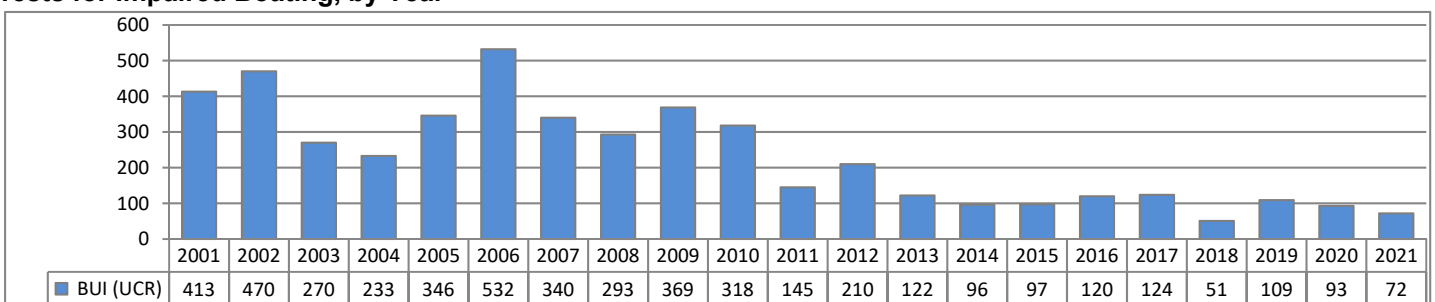
### Recreational Boating Crashes Involving Alcohol or Drug Impaired Operator

### Arrests for Impaired Boating, by Year



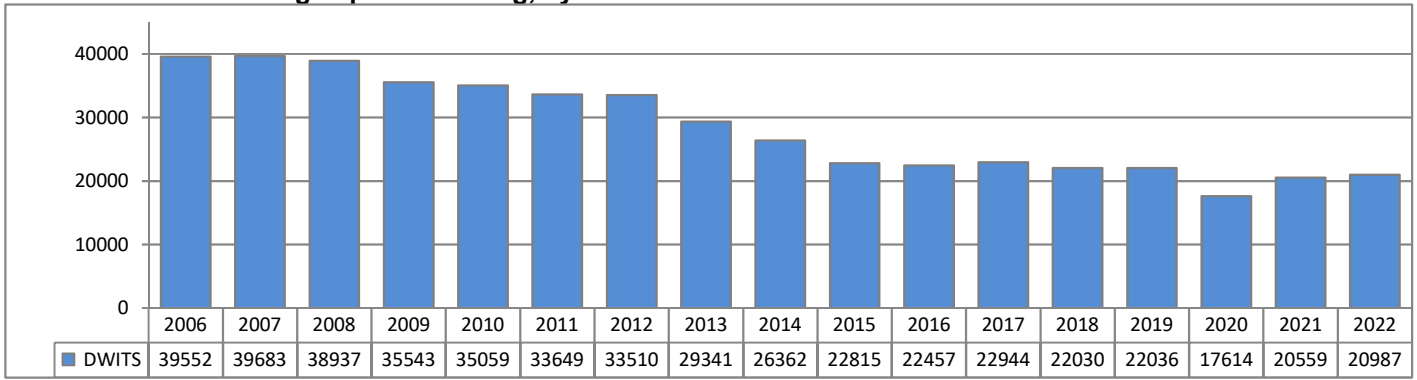

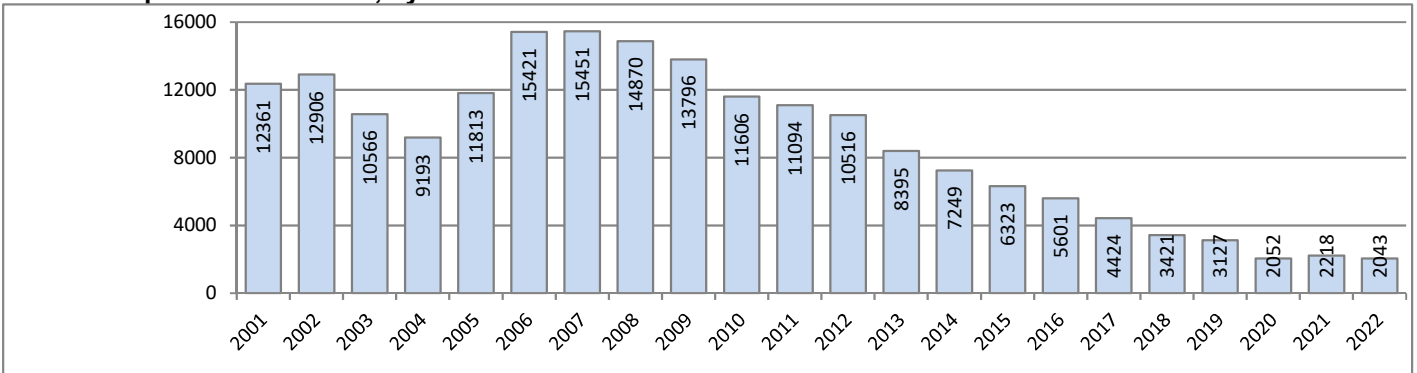

### Arrests for Alcohol or Drug Impaired Driving, by Year



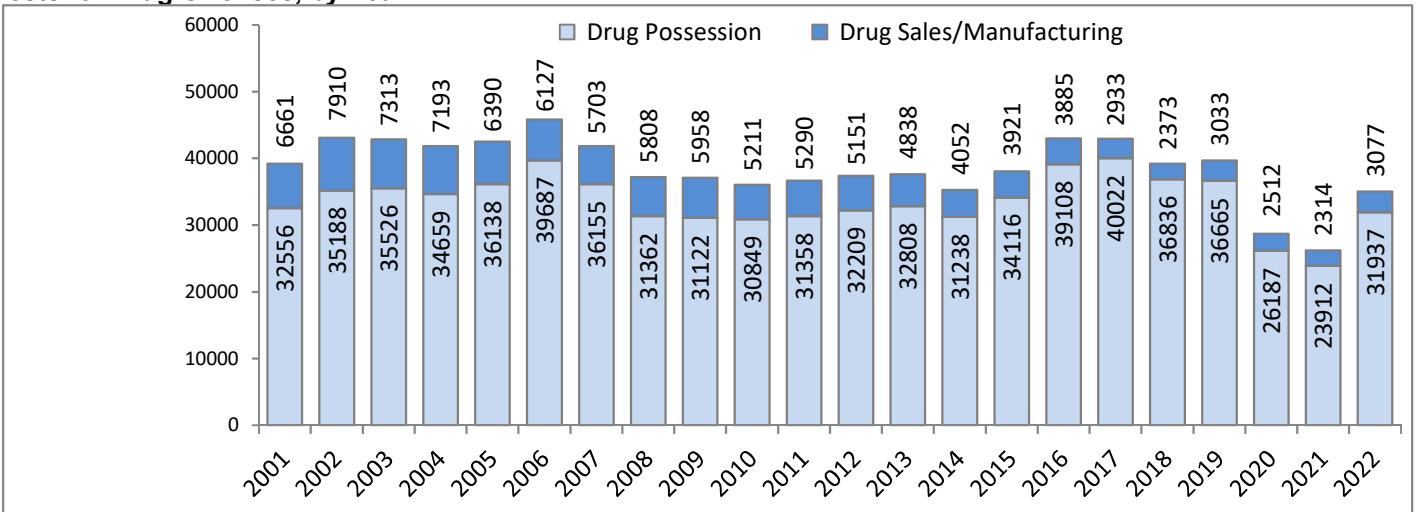

### Arrests for Liquor Law Offenses, by Year



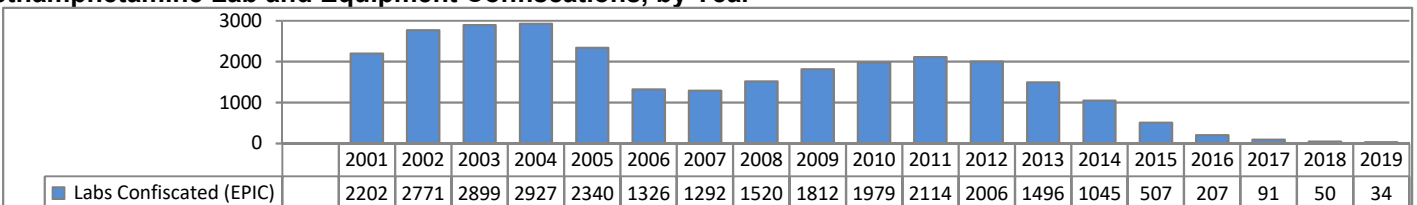

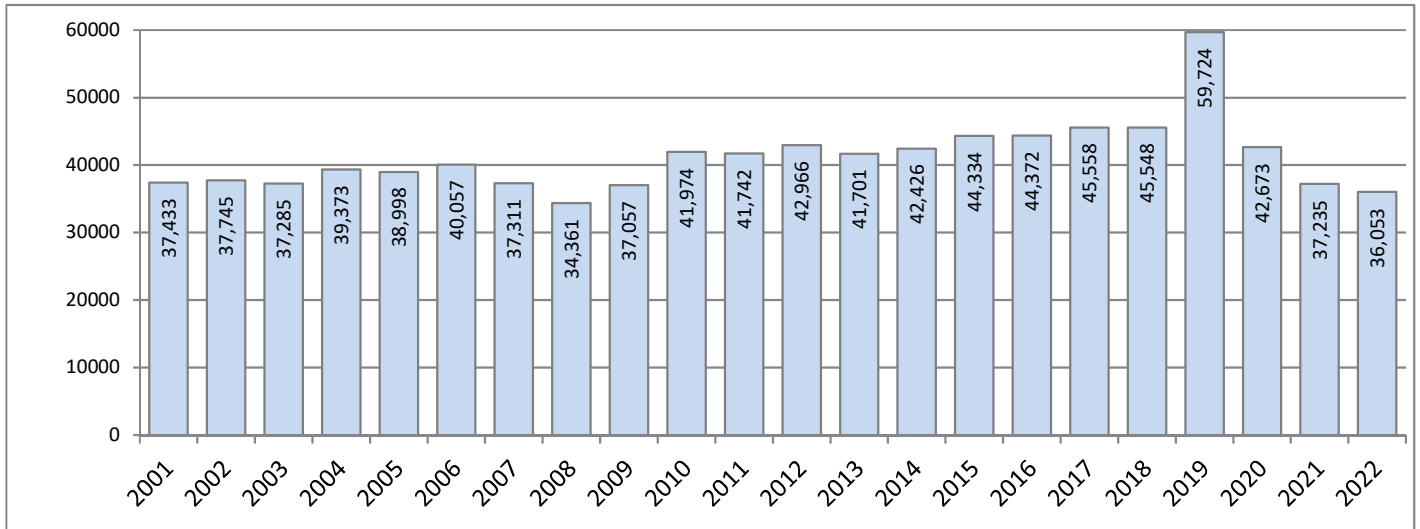
### Methamphetamine Lab and Equipment Confiscations, by Year



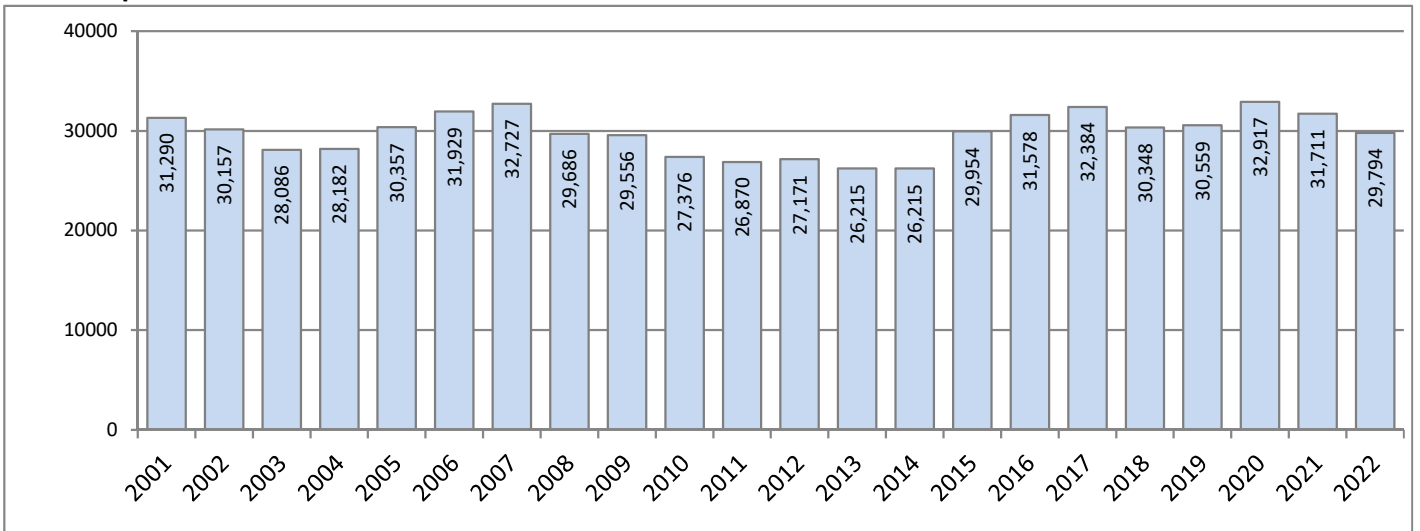

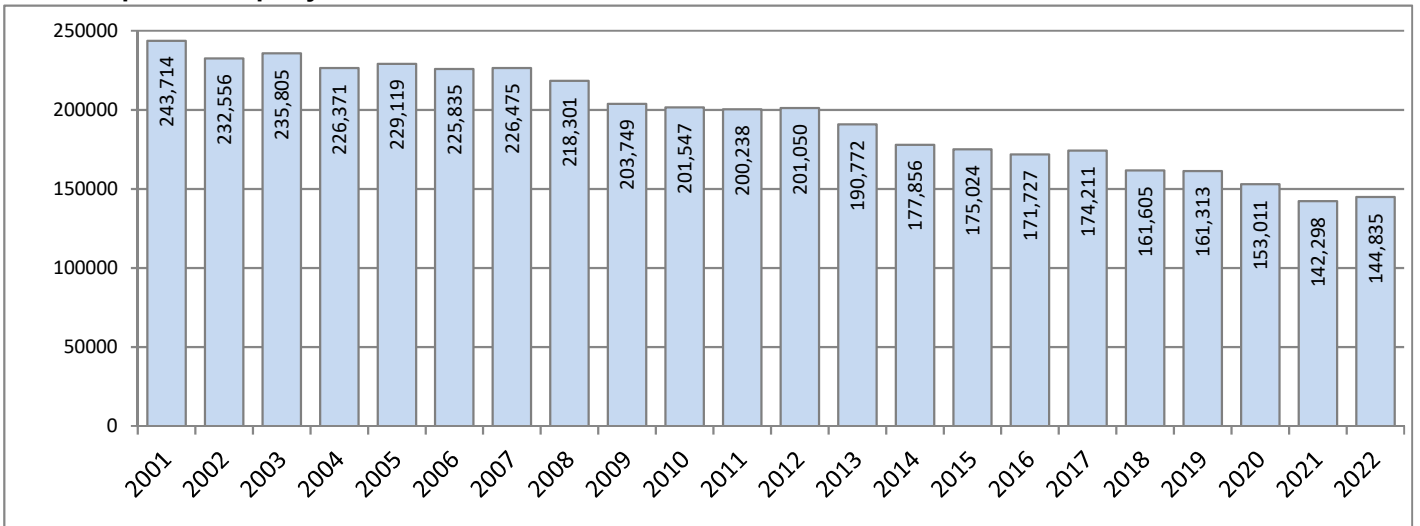

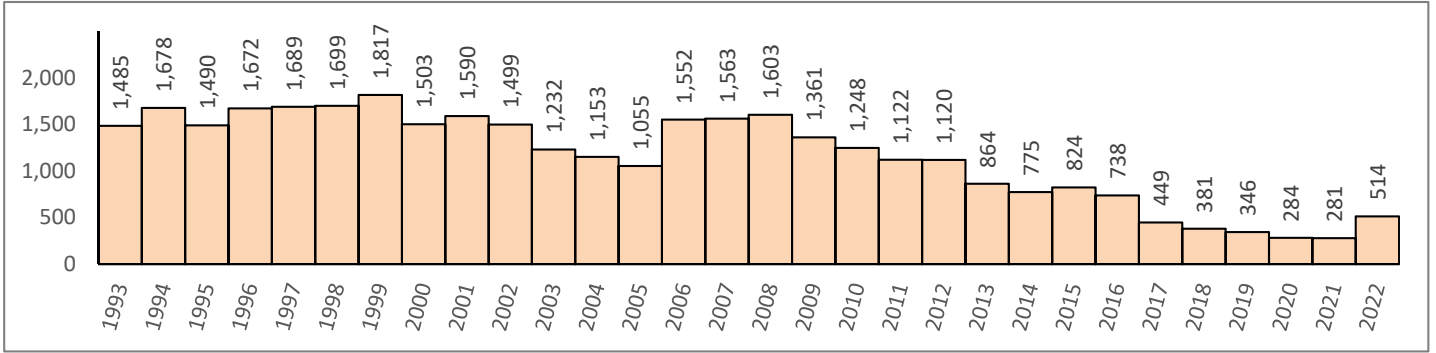

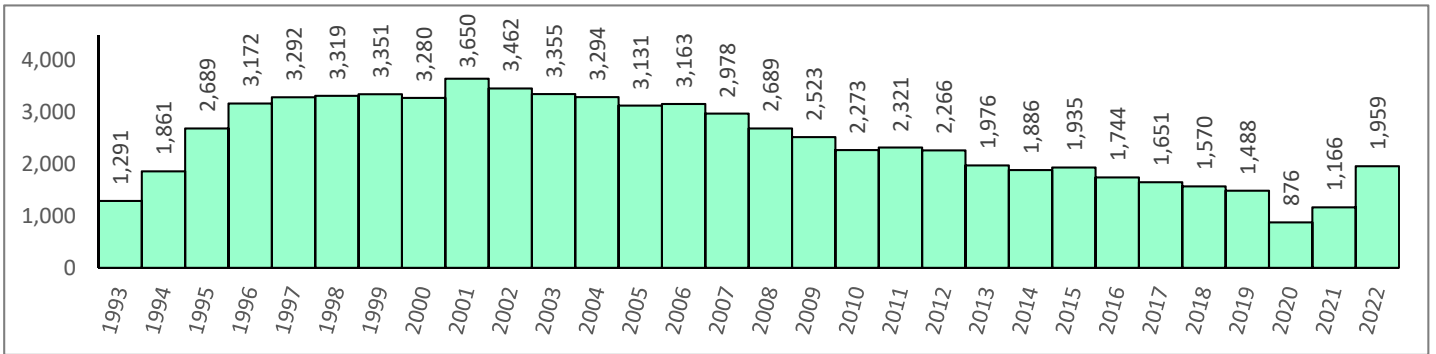

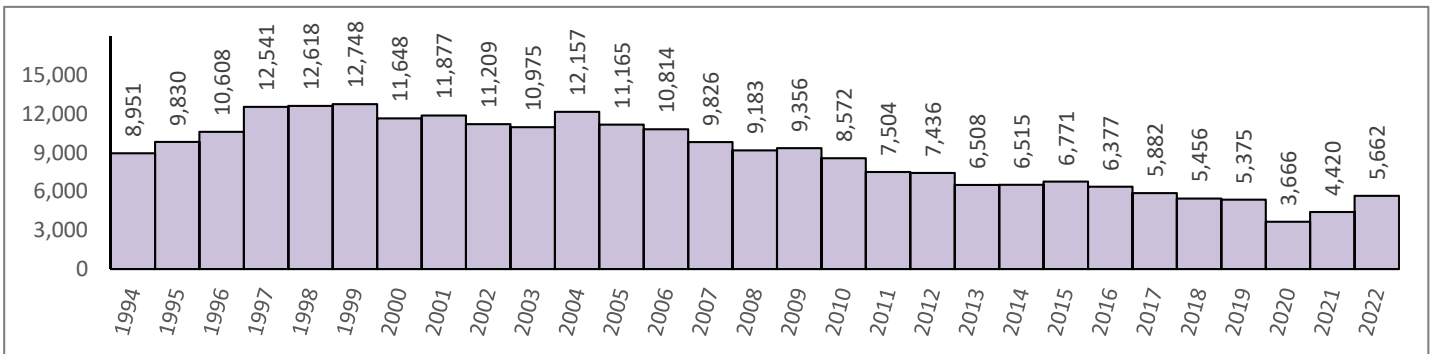
### Referrals to Juvenile Courts for Alcohol Offenses

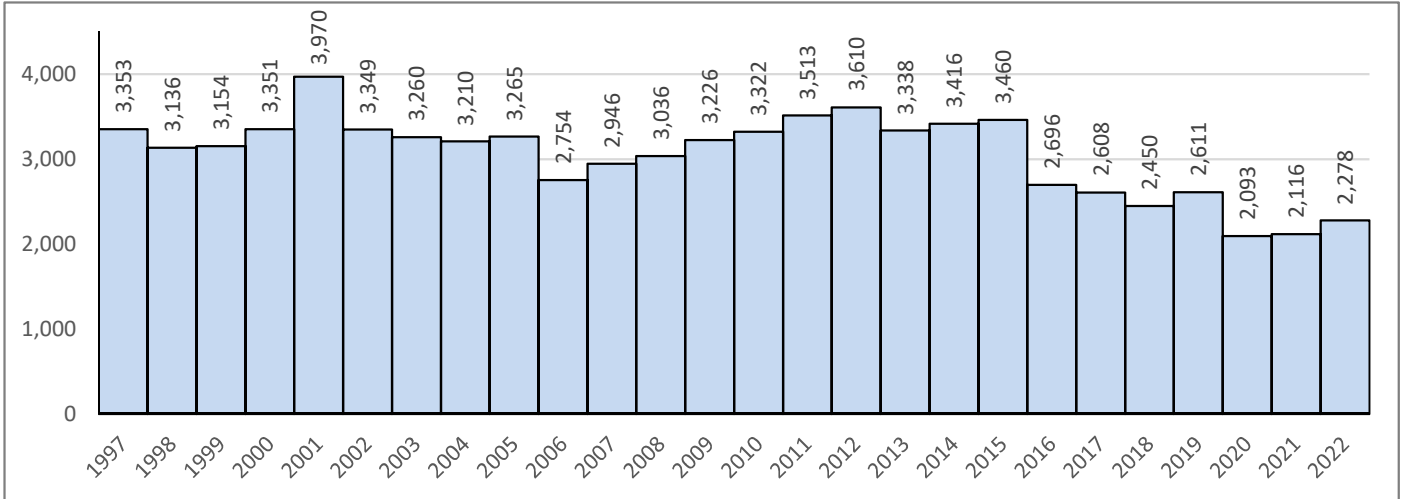

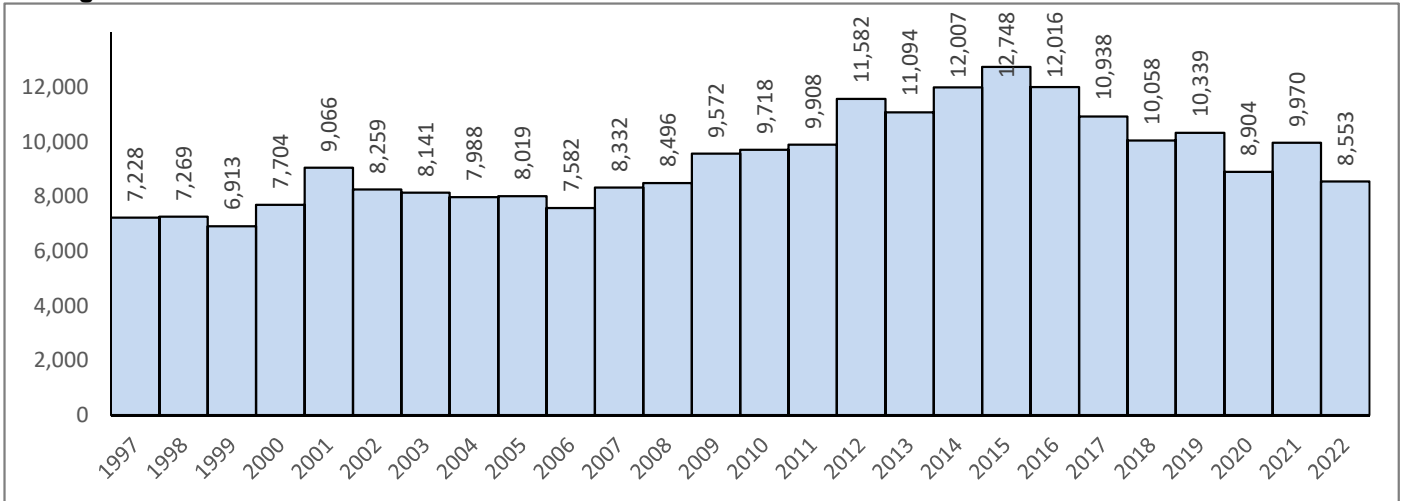

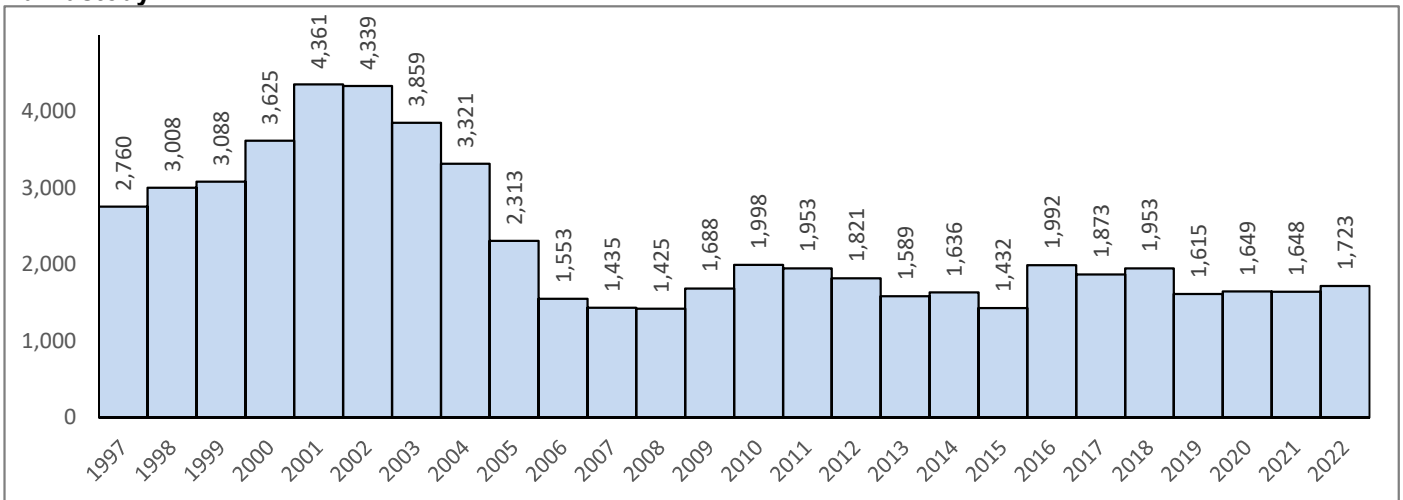

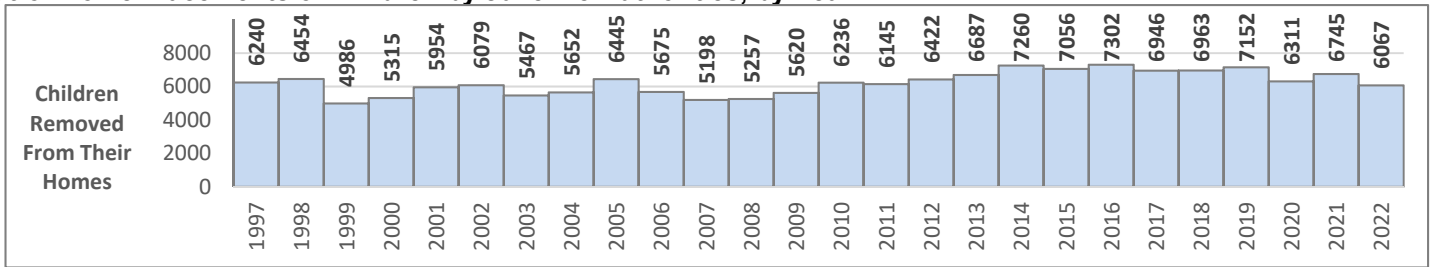

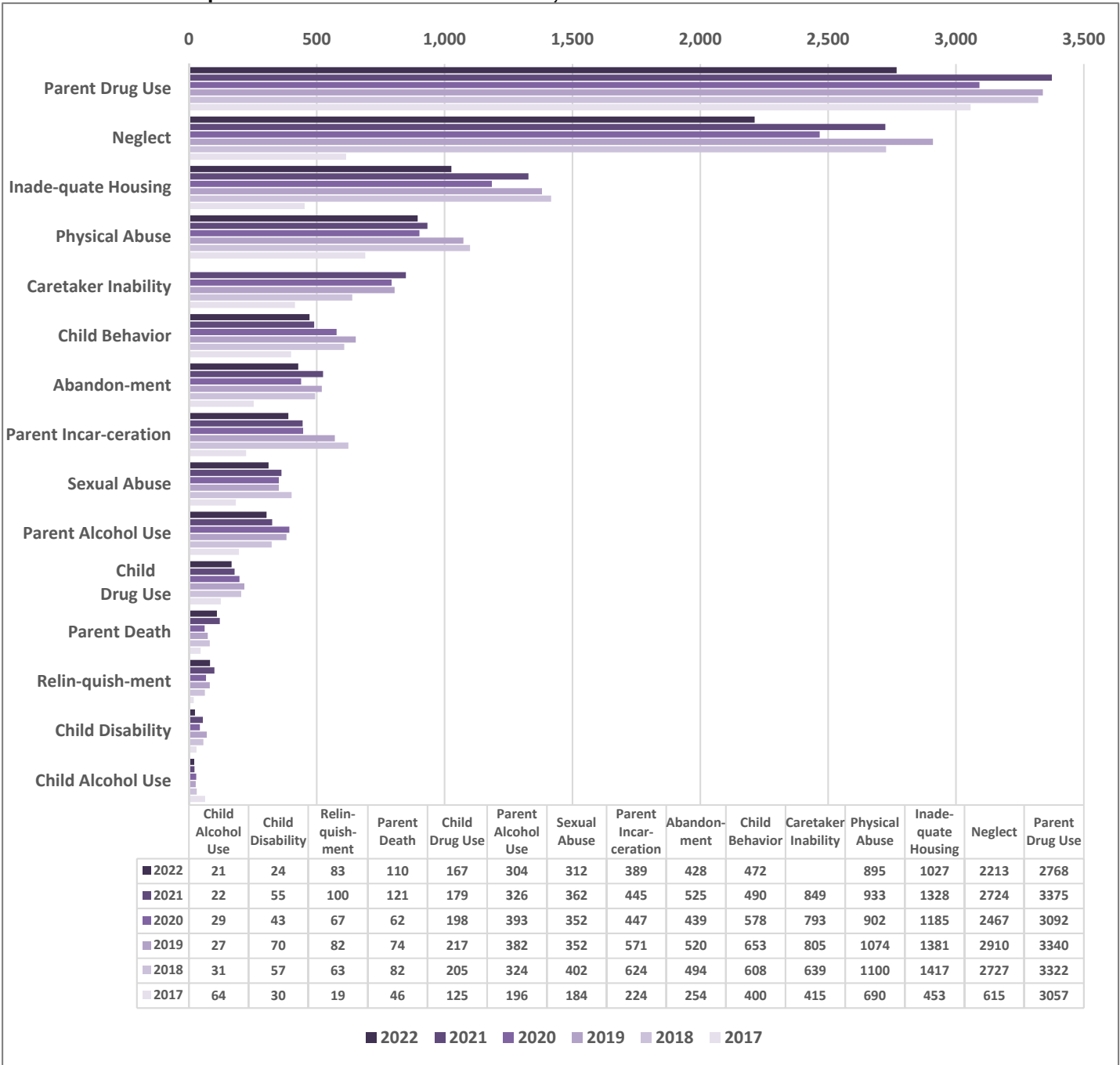

### Adverse Conditions Reported in Out-of-Home Placements, Calendar Years 2017-2022



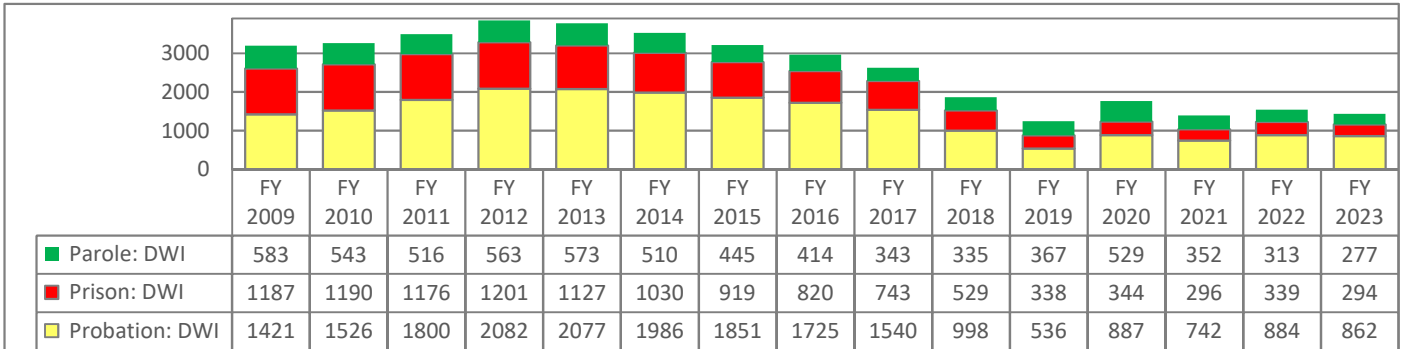

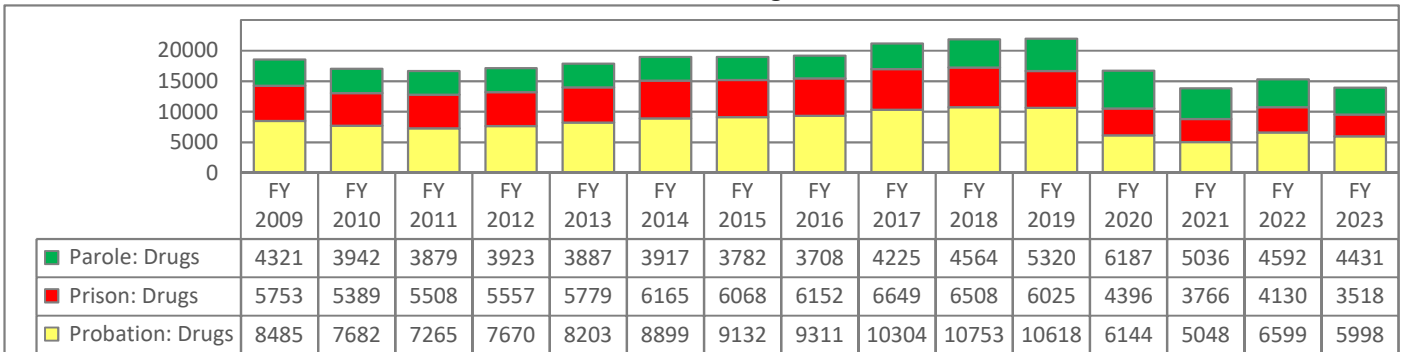

### Probation, Prison, and Parole/Conditional Release for Driving While Intoxicated Convictions



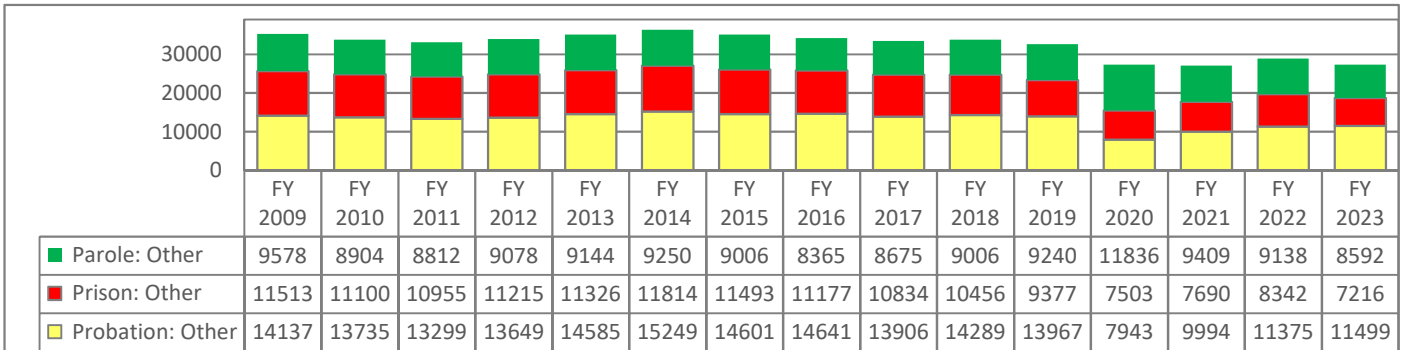

### Probation, Prison, and Parole/Conditional Release for Illicit Drug Convictions



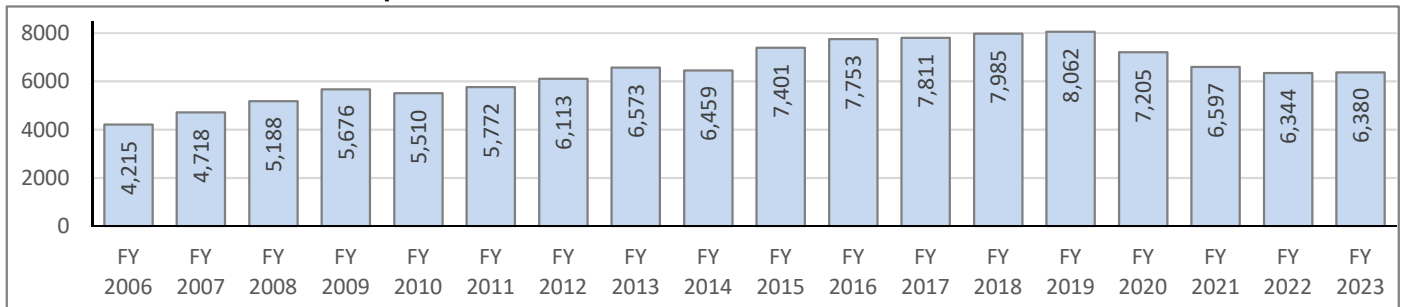

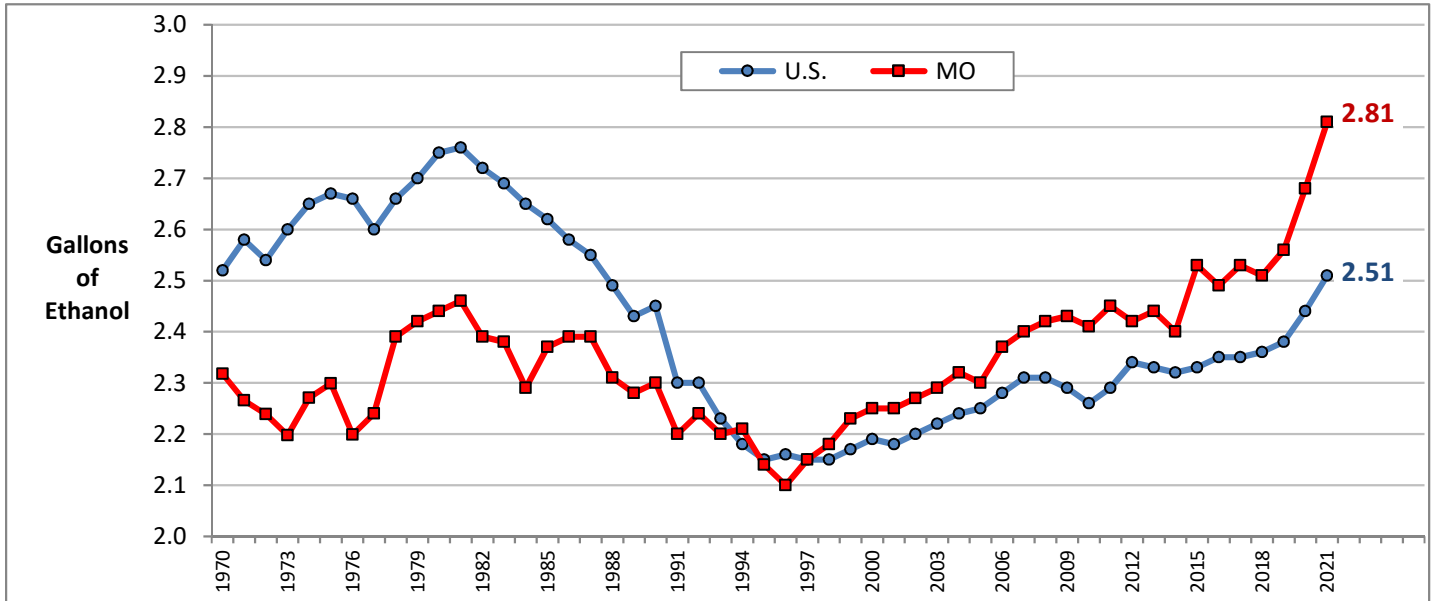

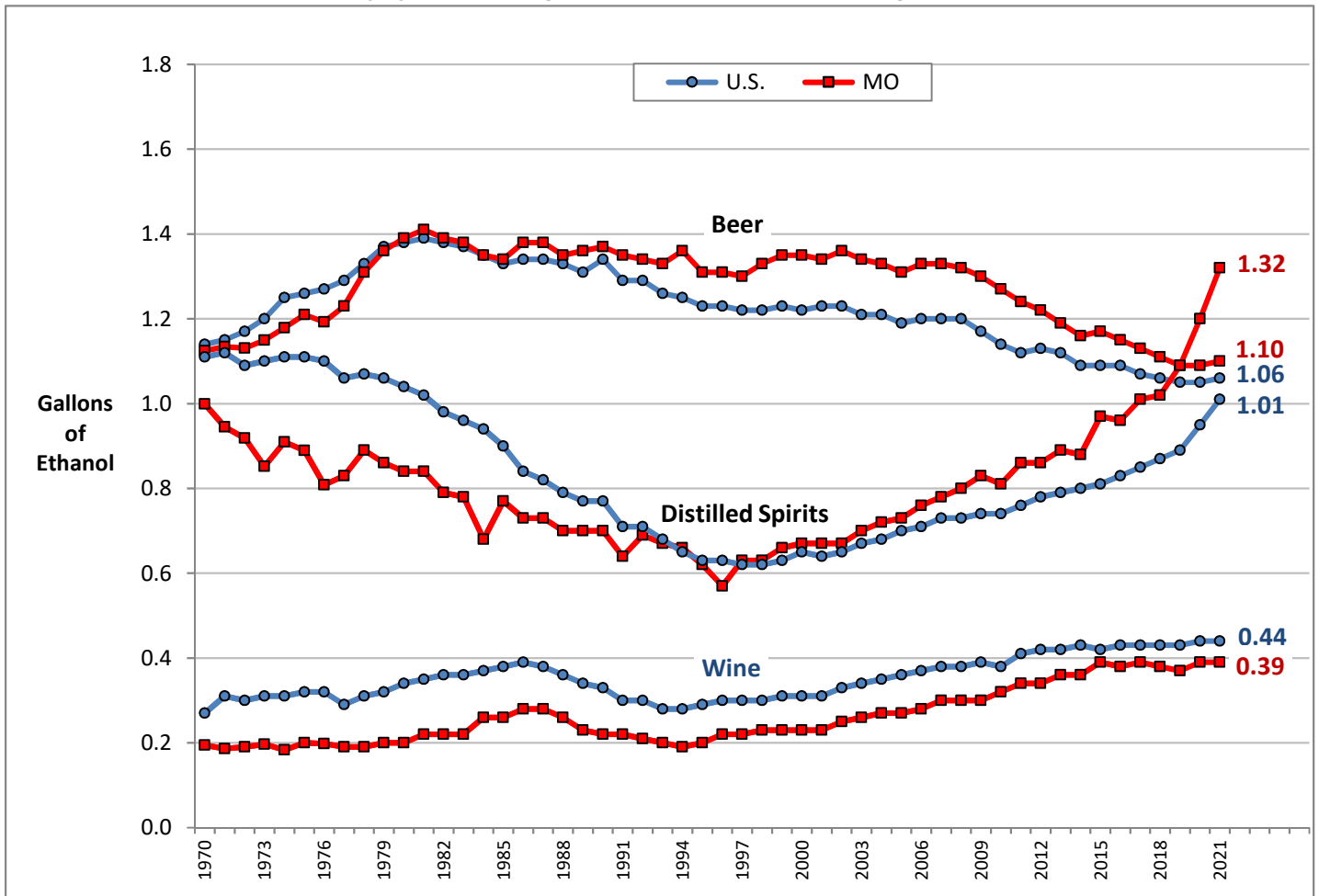

**Per Capita Consumption of Ethanol in All Beverage Alcohol: United States and Missouri, Ages 14 and Older, 1970-2021**



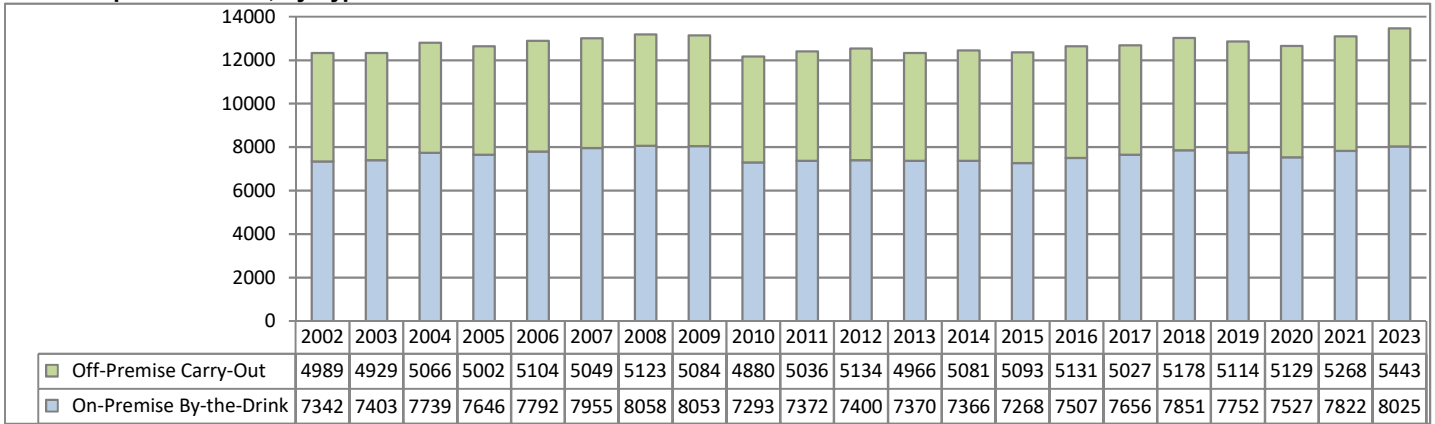
**Per Capita Consumption of Ethanol by Type of Beverage: United States and Missouri, Ages 14 and Older, 1970-2021**



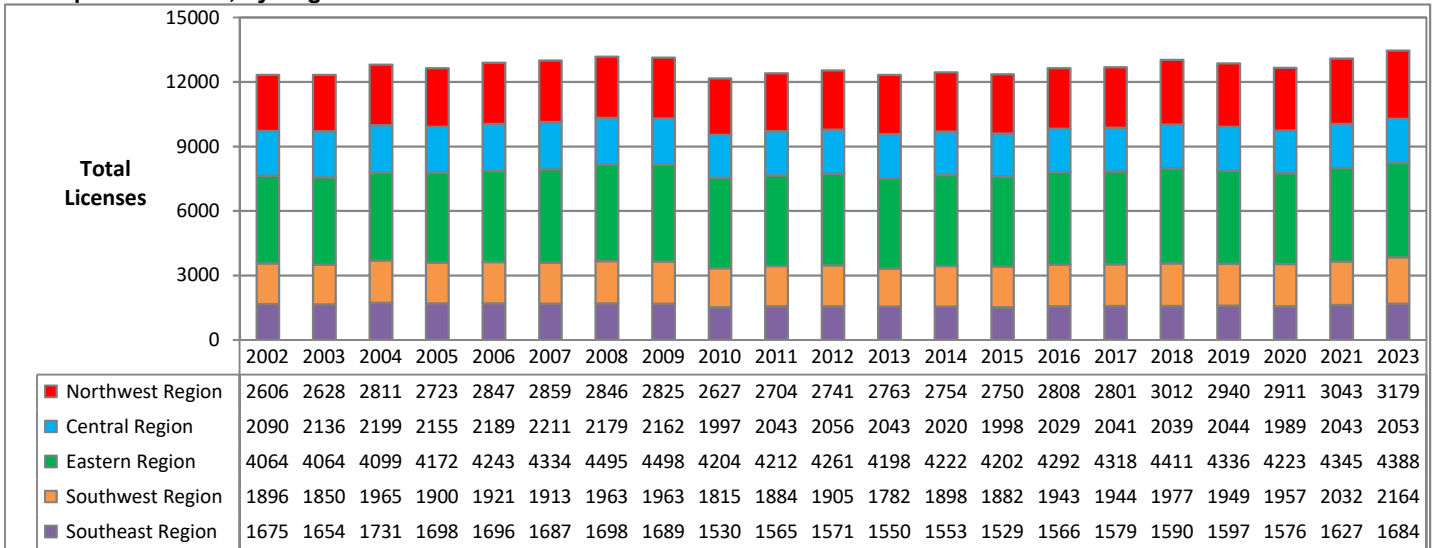

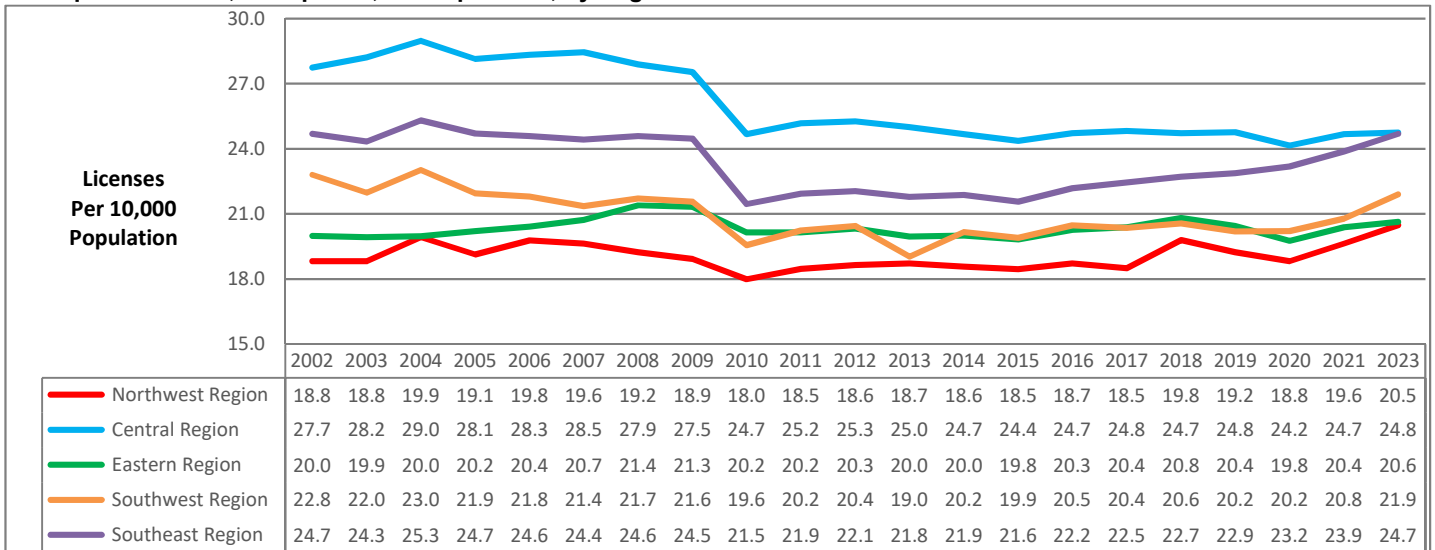
**Retail Liquor Licenses, by Type of License and Year**

**Retail Liquor Licenses, Rate per 10,000 Population, by Region and Year**

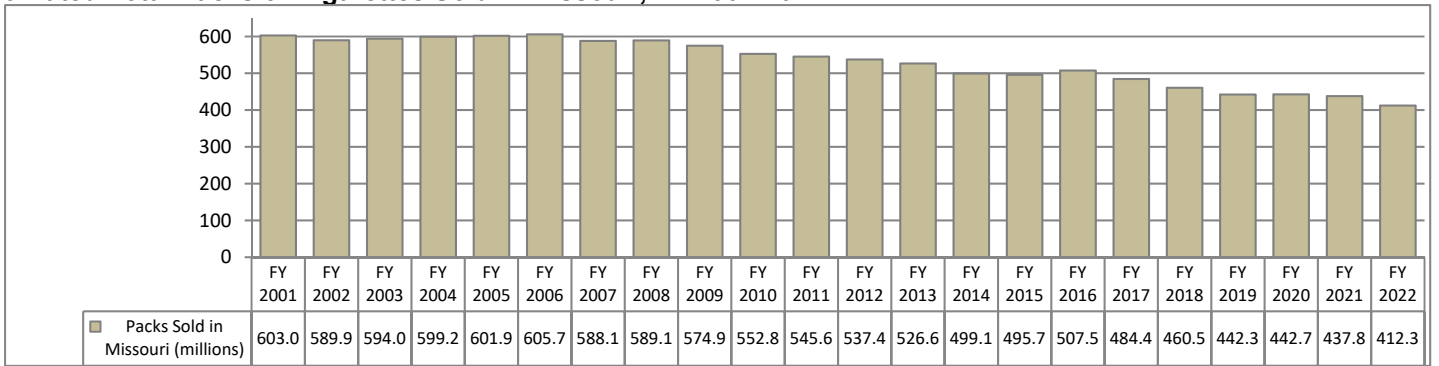

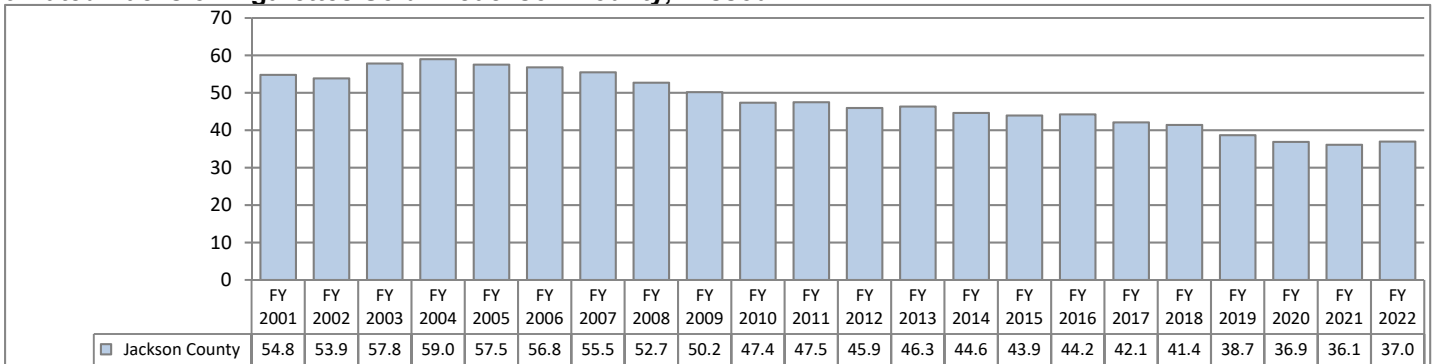

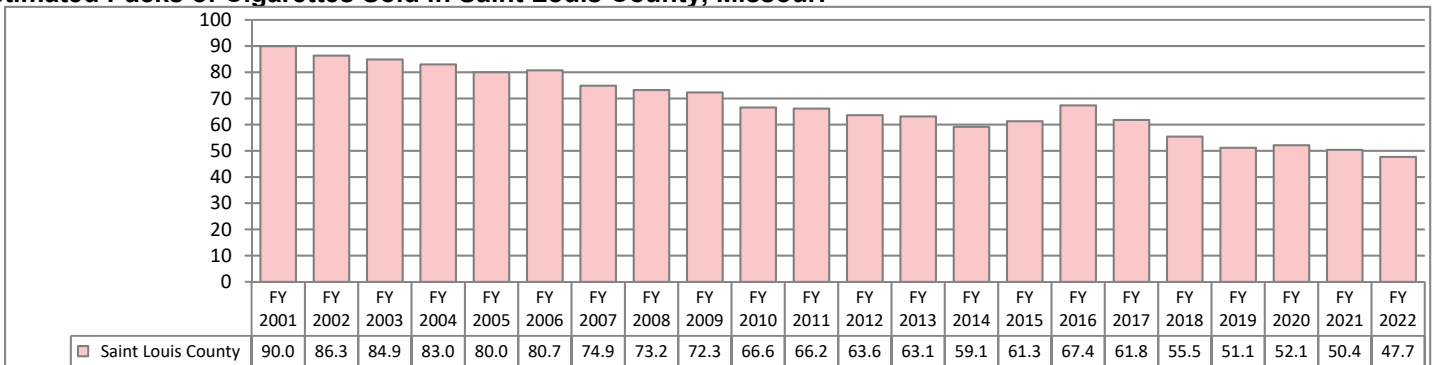
### Estimated Total Packs of Cigarettes Sold in Missouri, FY 2001-2021 \*



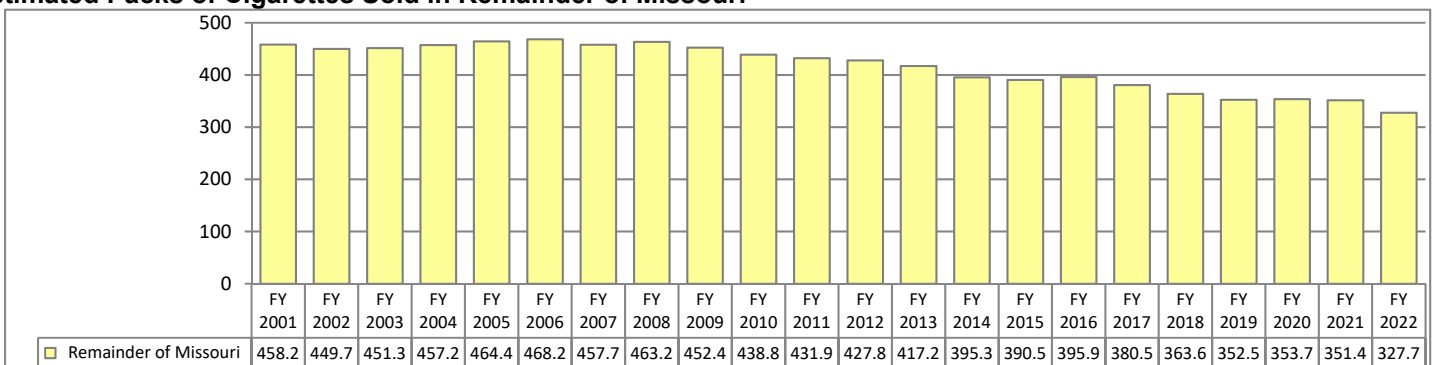
### Estimated Packs of Cigarettes Sold in Jackson County, Missouri \*\*

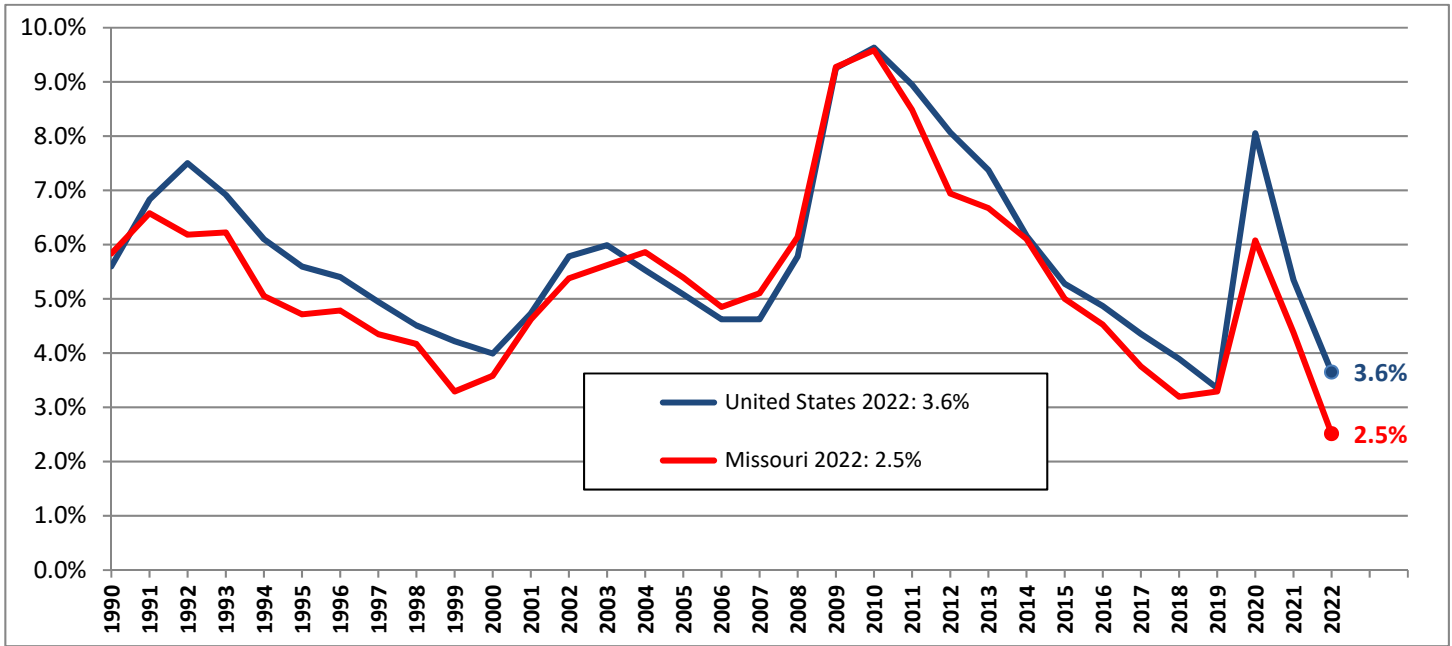

**Unemployment Rates in the United States and Missouri: Annualized Percentages, by Year**



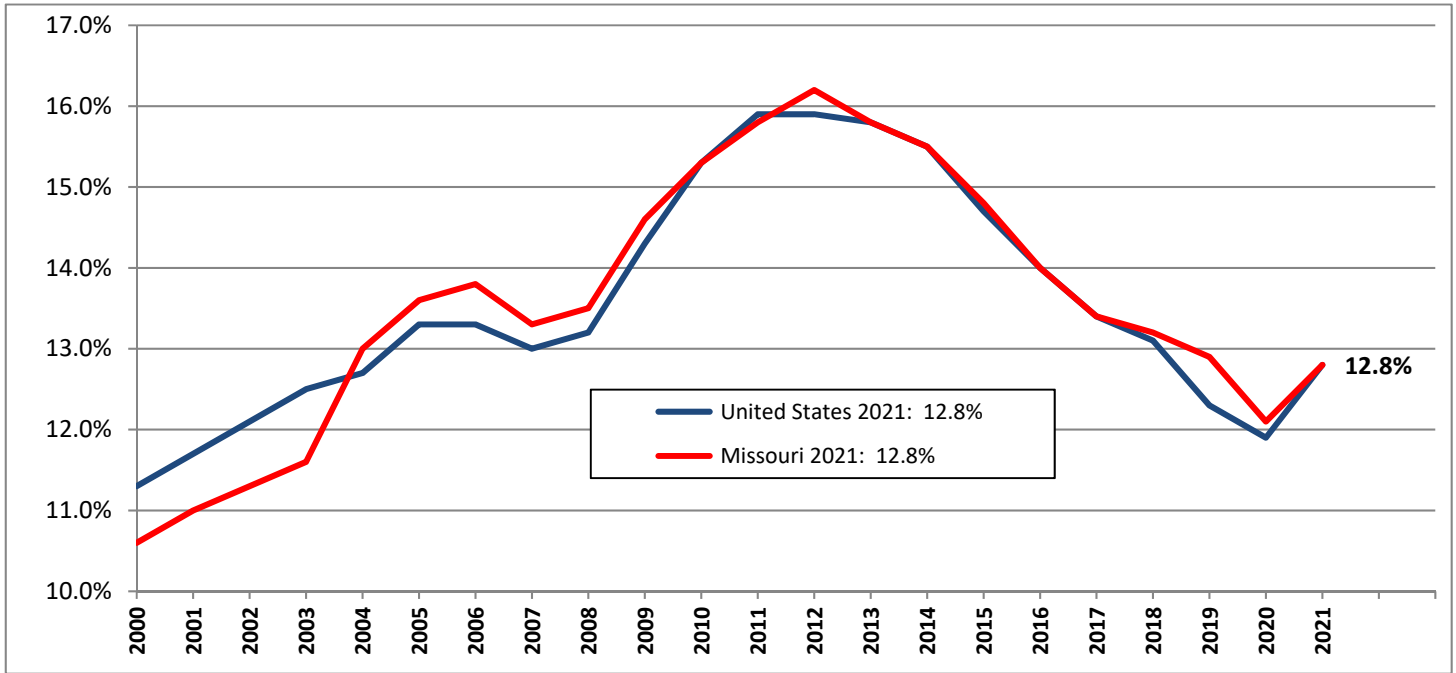

**Poverty Rates in the United States and Missouri: Annualized Percentages, by Year**



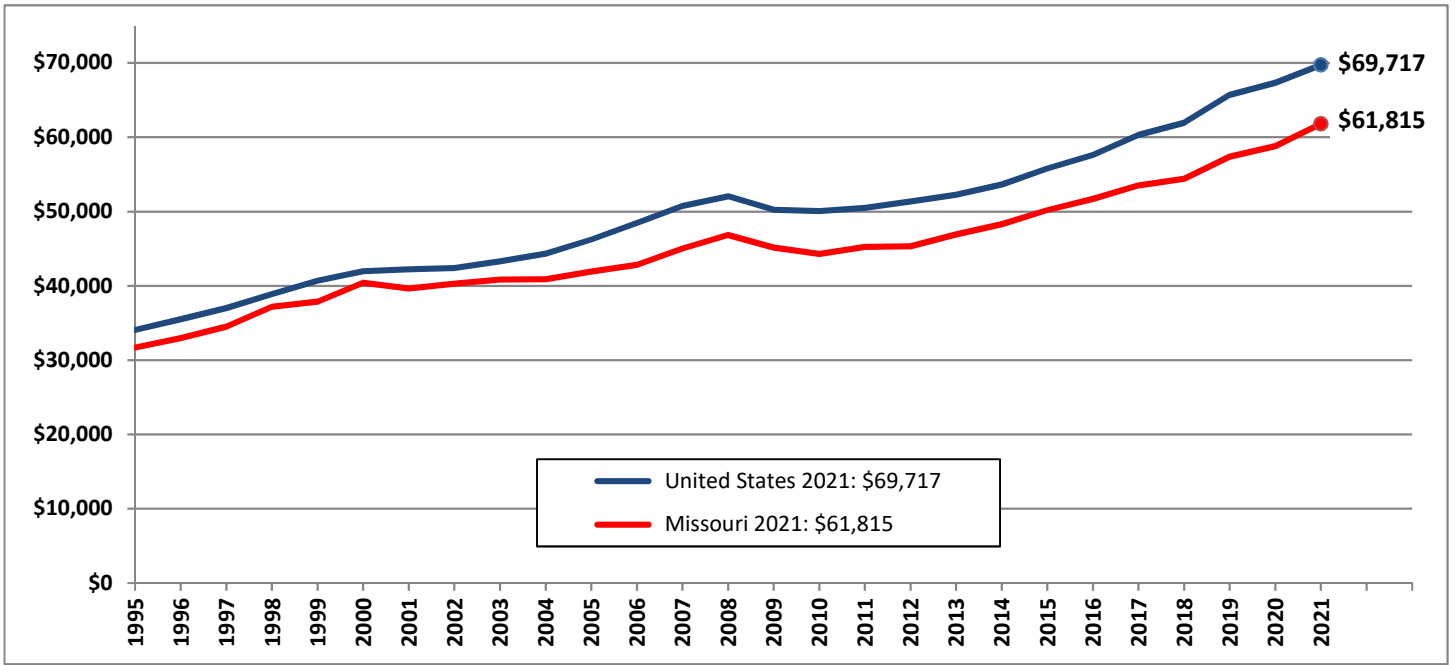
