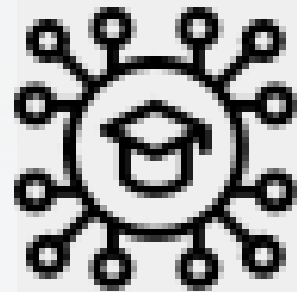
Missouri Alliance for Dual Diagnosis (MOADD)

WHAT'S AN ECHO?

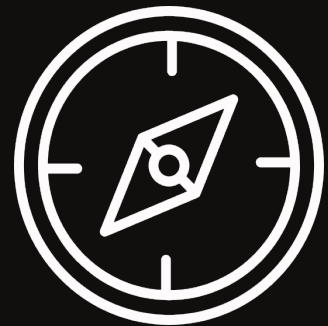


- Extension for Community Health Outcomes (ECHO)

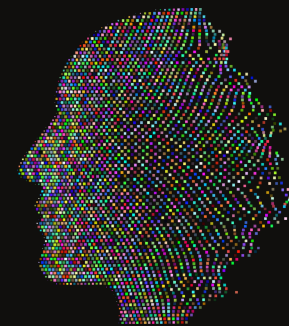

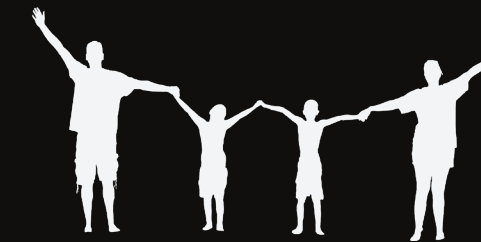

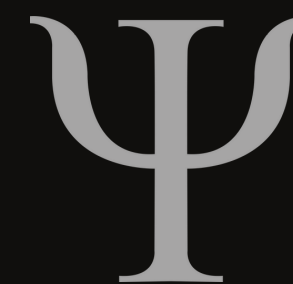

Improve treatment outcomes of children and transitional age youth with dual diagnoses and increase Missouri community health provider and other providers self-efficacy, knowledge, and understanding of evidence-based best practices in caring for children with intellectual/developmental disabilities and/or autism and behavioral health diagnoses.

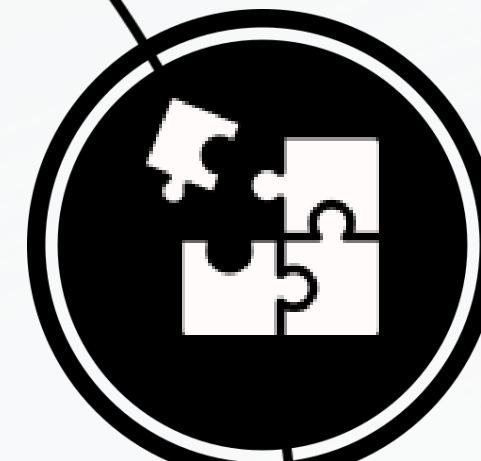
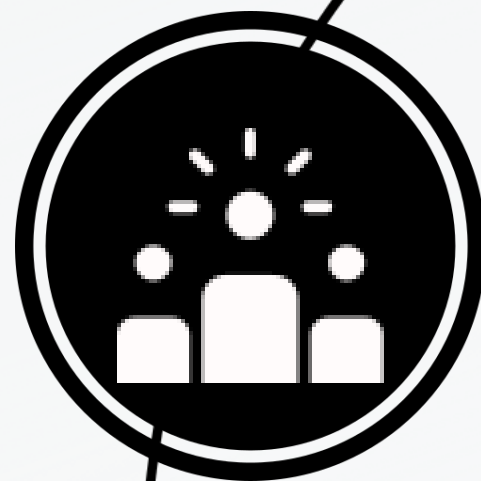

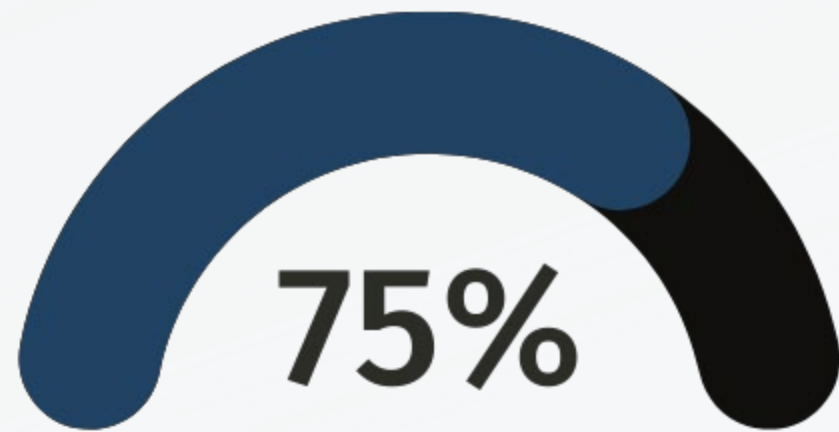

LET'S TALK DATA

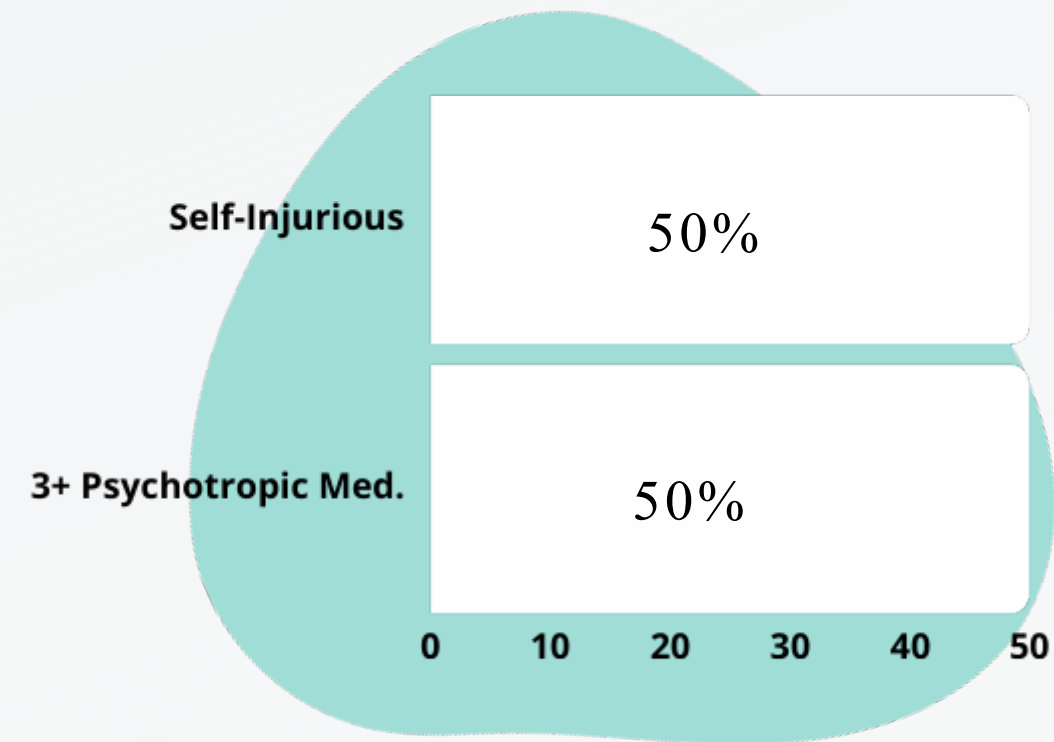
MOADD Pilot

1st year focused on 24 youth cases. Youth ranged from 5 - 18 with dual intellectual/developmental and/or Autism and a clinically suspected or identified behavioral diagnosis that met one high risk category. (self-injurious behavior, psychiatric hospitalizations; residential treatment placements; theft; elopement; psychotropic medications; and property destruction)



High Risk Factor: Aggression

Case presenters identified that of the youth 75% (18) had aggression towards peers and/or adults.



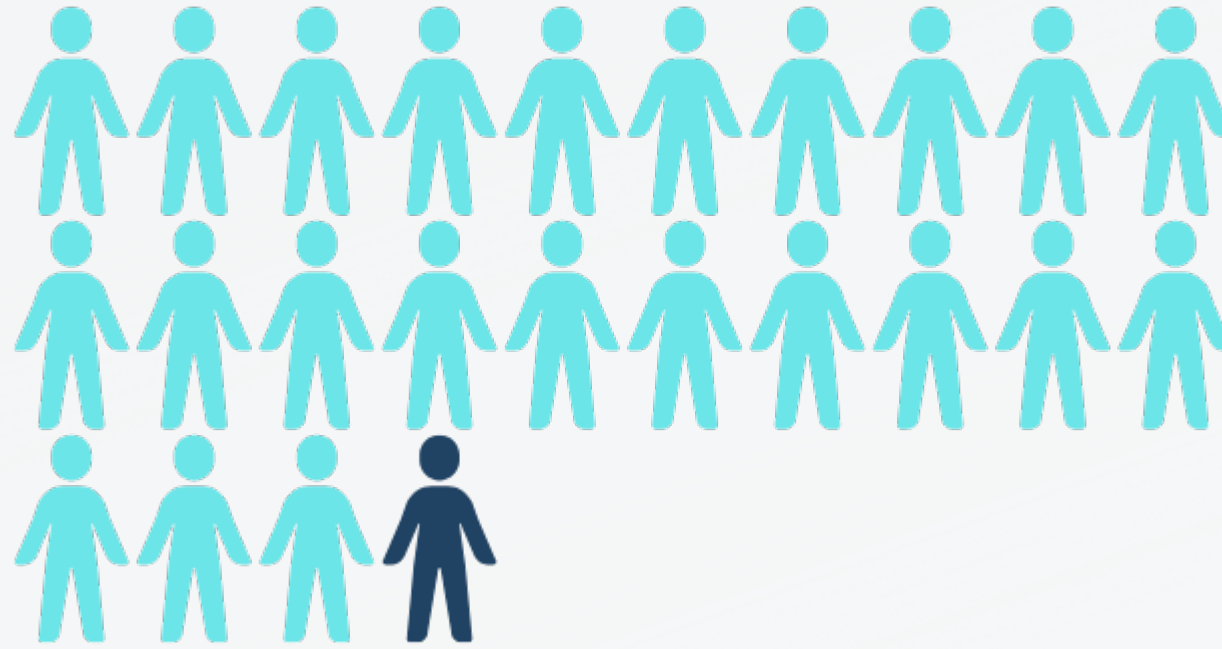
High Risk Indicators

In addition to aggression, case presenters identified 50% (12) had self-injurious behavior; 45.8% (11) had been in psychiatric hospitalization or residential care facility in the last year, and 50% (12) were on 3 or more psychotropic medications.

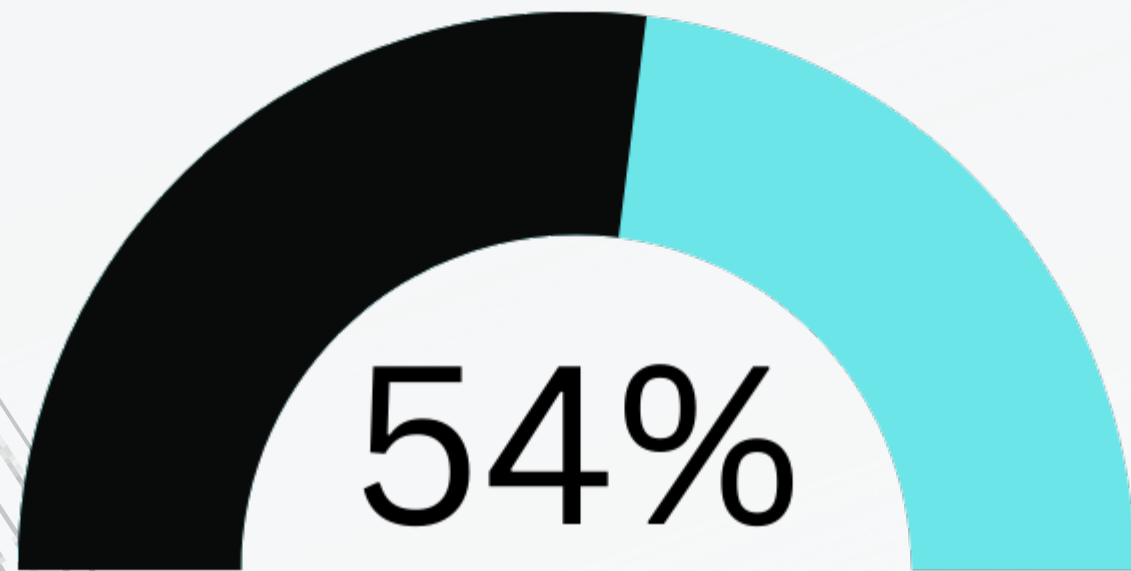
MOADD ECHO PILOT

Recommendations

95.8% (23) of the case presentations the expert panel recommended additional medical support; the main support was medication support or evaluation to identify the right medication combinations or explore unconsidered medication classes.



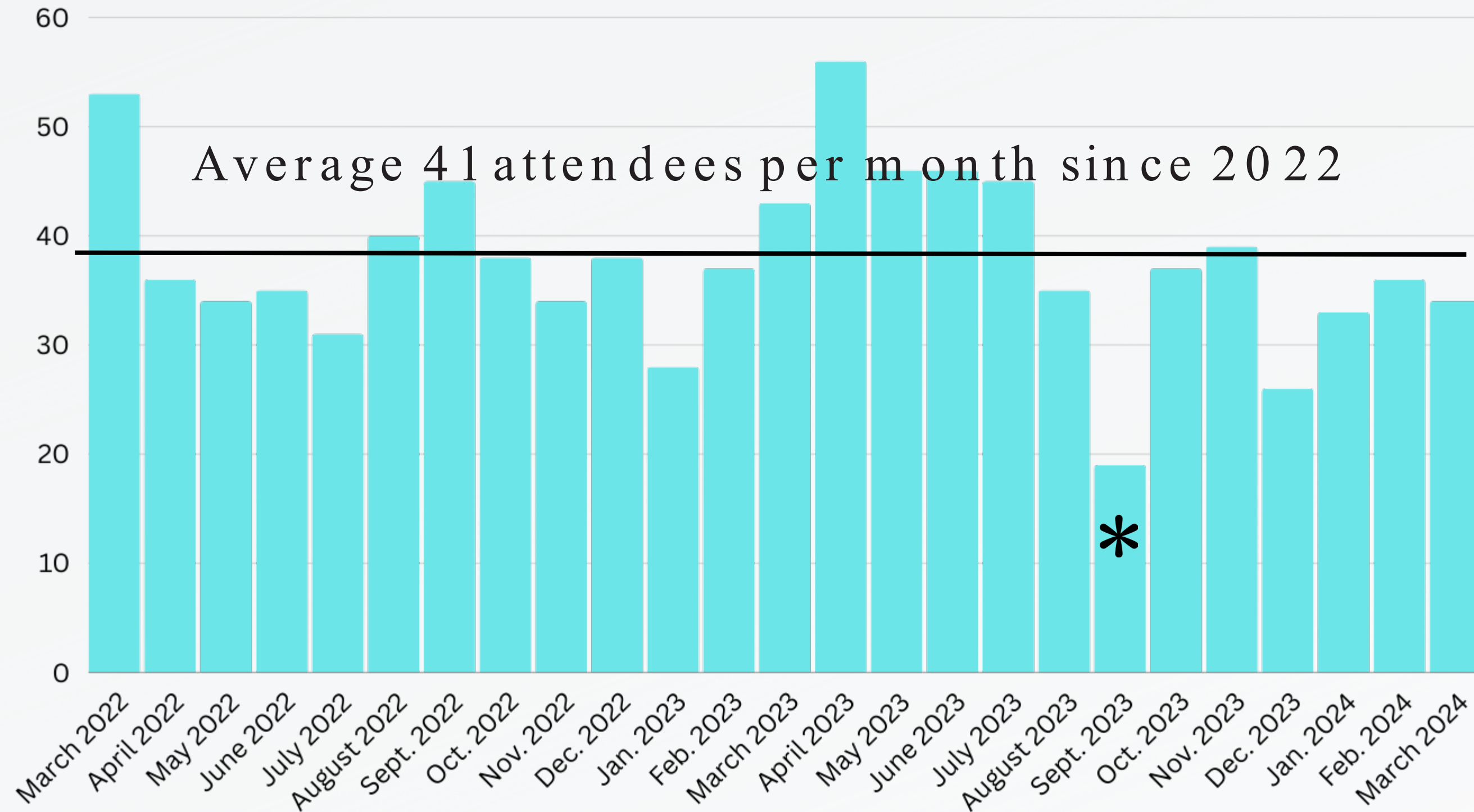
100% of cases had concerns around coordination of care



Behavior Service Recommendations

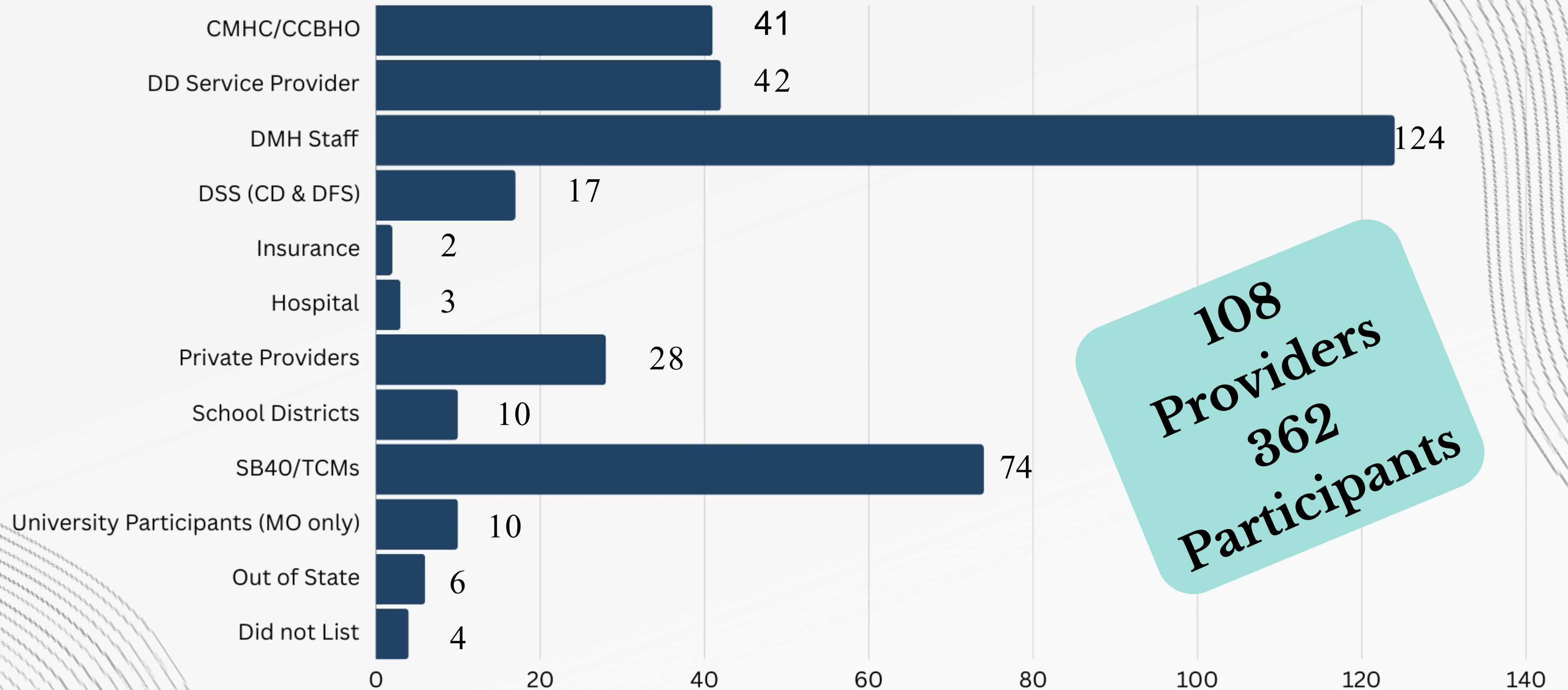
54.2% (13) of the cases presented the expert panel recommends the restarting of Applied Behavior Services or re-evaluation strategies to address individual's behaviors by current behavior providers.

ATTENDANCE DATA

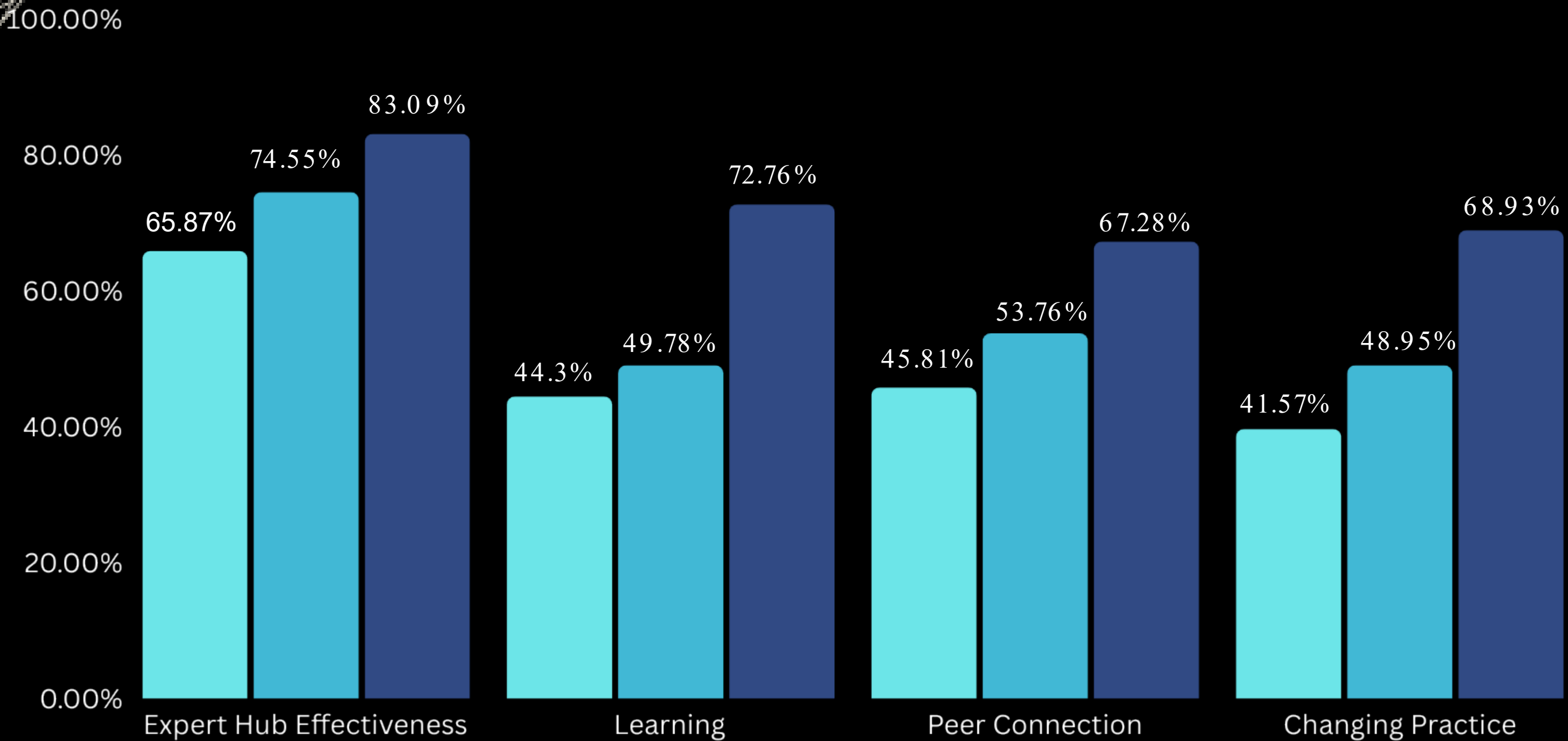

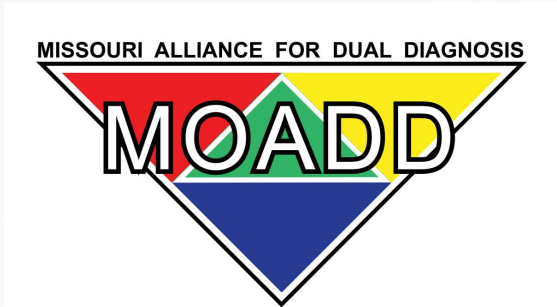

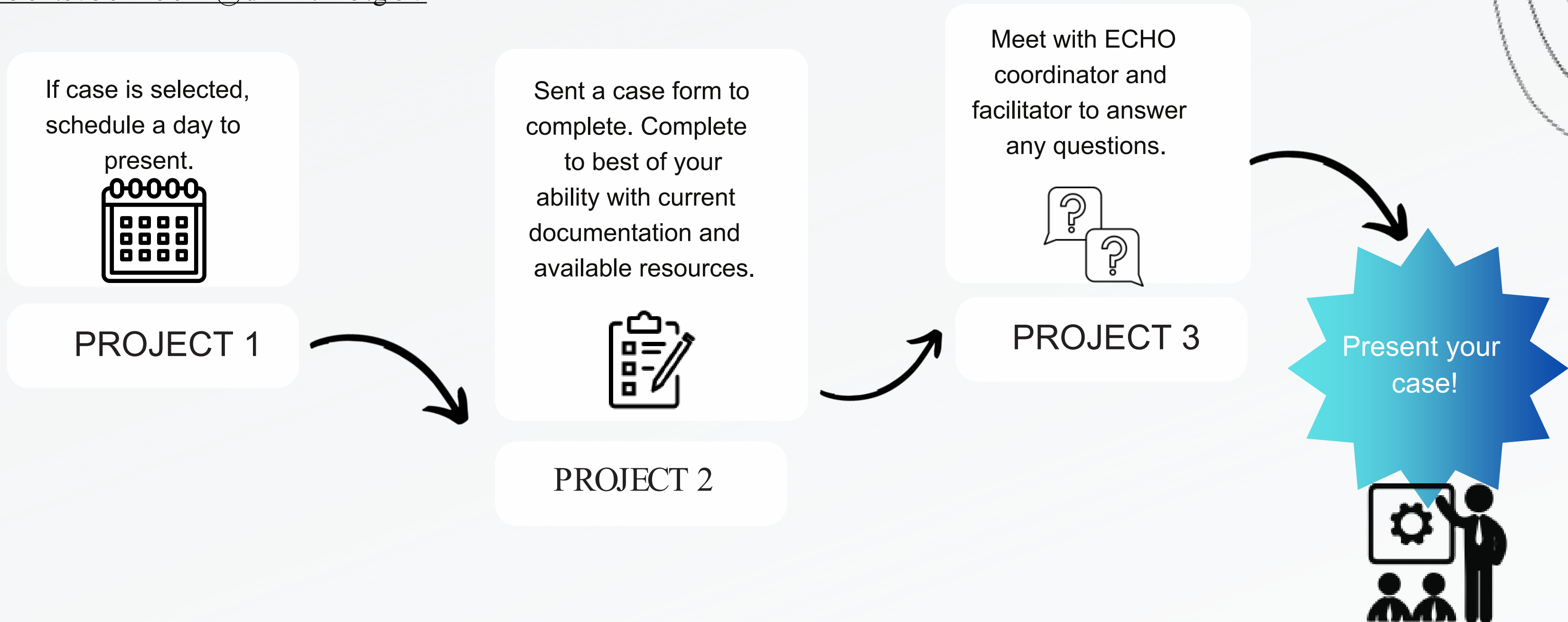

HOW TO PRESENT AN ECHO

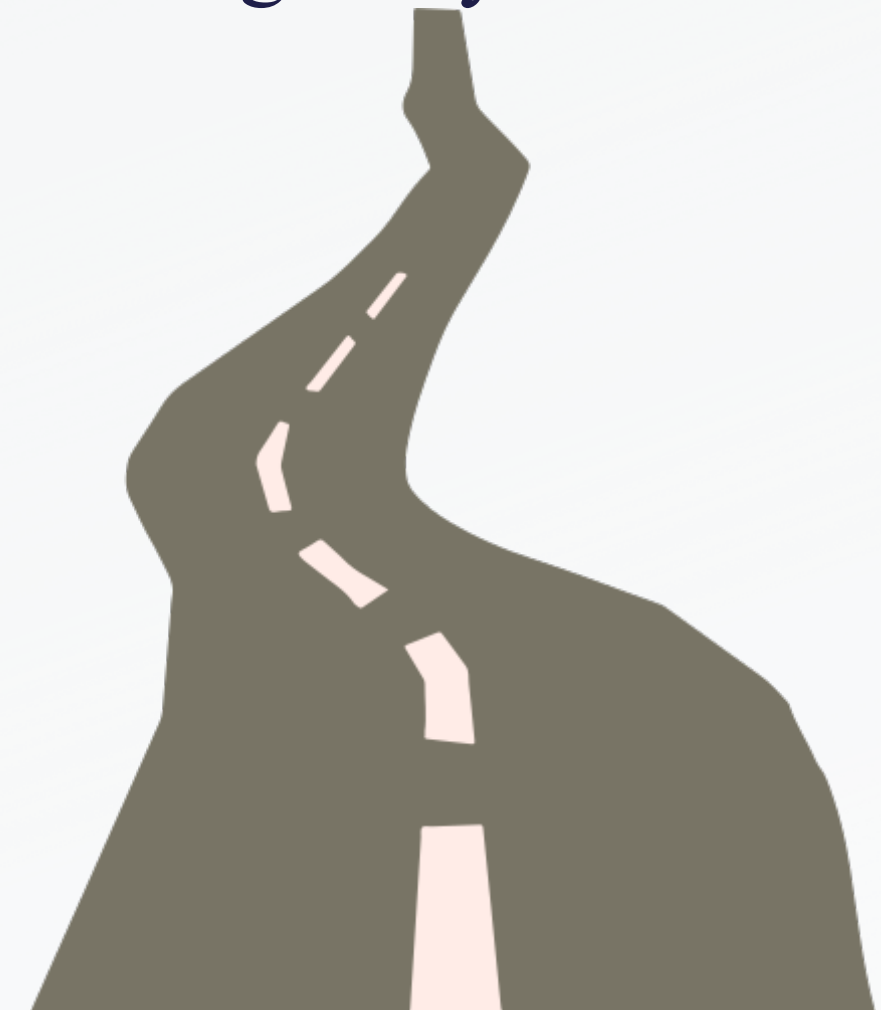

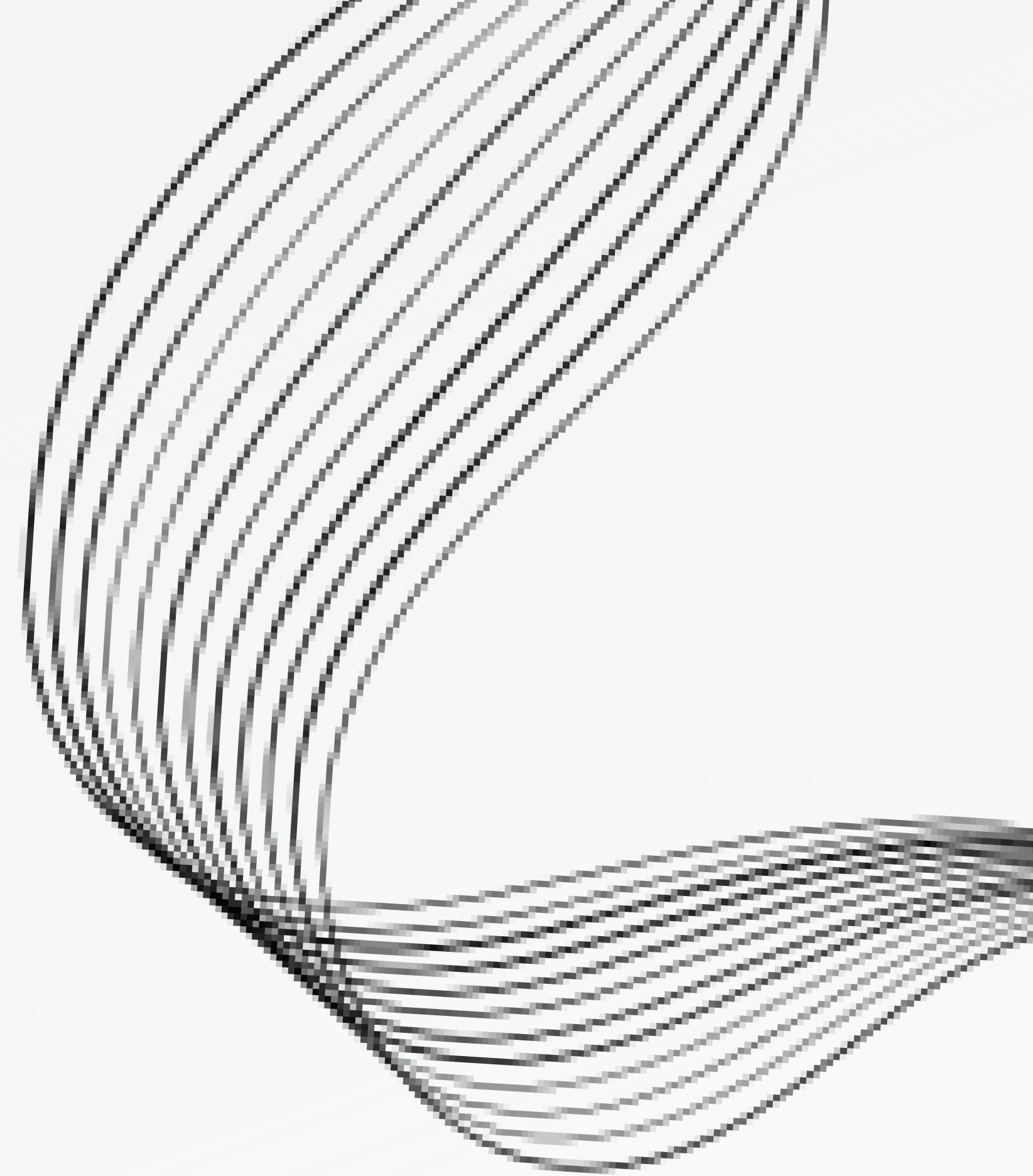
